


## How do the recent CCECI rate changes affect your bill?

Recently the Clinton County Electric Cooperative Board of Trustees approved a rate change that took effect with the January consumption billed in February, 2013. The overall revenues of Clinton County Electric are not increasing, however, some members are experiencing a slight rate increase, while others are experiencing a slight rate decrease. In order to see the effect the January rate change has on your electric bill, we have developed a web-based tool that will answer that question. You will need access to the internet and a copy of your billing statement to use this tool.



- Simply go to www.cceci.com and look for a button that looks like a
  calculator on the home page (scroll down towards the bottom of the
  home page screen to find it). Click on the calculator and a pop-up
  screen will appear.
- 2. Determine and enter the rate schedule you are being served on (found on the lower left hand corner of your electric billing statement).
- 3. Then answer "yes" or "no" to the question concerning "Are there two lines of energy charges on your bill" (a second line of energy would refer to members who have electric heating systems such as Geothermal or High Efficiency Electric Heat Pumps).
- 4. Now you are ready to click the "Next" button.
- 5. Enter the number of kWh from "kWh usage" found in the middle of your electric bill and click the "Next" button again.
- 6. Here you will see the "change" and "percent change" the new rate has on your electric bill.
