

Calculating New Rates

Recently, the Clinton County Electric Cooperative Board of Trustees approved a slight rate increase that took effect with the January consumption billed in February, 2014. The overall revenues of Clinton County Electric will increase by approximately \$600,000; every member's increase and % increase will be different. In order to see the affect 2014's slight rate increase had on your electric bill, we have developed a web-based tool that will figure your increase. You will need access to the internet and a copy of your billing statement to use this tool.



1. Simply go to www.cceci.com and look for a button that looks like a calculator on the home page. Click on the calculator and a pop-up screen will appear.
2. Determine and enter the rate schedule you are being served on (found in the center of your billing statement under the heading "Rate Schedule/Bill Type").
3. Then answer yes or no to the question concerning "Are there two lines of energy charges on your bill" (a second line of energy would refer to members who have electric heating

4. Now you are ready to click the "Next" button.
5. Enter the number of kWh from "kWh Used" found in the middle of your electric bill and click the "Next" button again.
6. Here you will see the "change" and "percent change" the new rate has on your electric bill.
