Wildlife Ecologist Dr. Ron Larkin along with two graduate research students from the University of Illinois in Champaign spent three weeks at the wind turbine in September. Our Electrical Engineer in training Justin Gumbel also helped with the study.



Dr. Larkin and his assistants were present at the turbine from dusk until dawn, when bats are most active. Radar is used to see movement in the air. The radar then locks on and tracks the movement. Night vision goggles were also used to see if bats were nesting in nearby trees.

The data collected from the study will be used to develop a plan with Illinois Department of Natural Resources to operate the wind turbine in a way that will continue to benefit the membership.

Fall is here and with it comes cooler temperatures. Here are a few tips to save energy while staying warm:

- During the day, open shades and curtains to allow solar heating. Close them at night to retain the day's heat.
- Check your home's weather stripping for air leaks around doors, windows, baseboards, and wherever pipes, wires, and vents enter the house. Make sure the warm air you paid for won't escape.
- Check your heating system and replace furnace filters at least once every three months. Clean filters once a month during the heating season to keep the system at peak performance.


 Don't block your radiators or heating vents with furniture or draperies. Keep your radiators, registers and baseboard heaters dirt and dust free. Close vents and doors in unused rooms.
