Educating and Developing Tomorrow's Cooperative Leaders

Reely Acheson of Rushville and Spencer Cooper of Bushnell represented McDonough Power Cooperative; Sydney Bigger of Media, Jessica Herndon of Macomb, Jack Lucie of Basco, and Brady Smith of Macomb represented McDonough Telephone Cooperative, Inc. in Washington, D.C., during the annual "Youth to Washington" Tour, June 14-21. This event, sponsored by the electric and telephone cooperatives of Illinois since the late 1950s, is an introduction to our

democratic form of government and cooperatives for rural youth.

The students met with Congresswoman Cheri Bustos and were among 65 rural Illinois youth leaders selected for the trip. The Illinois students joined more than 1,520 young leaders from across the country. In addition to the Capitol, they also visited Arlington National Cemetery, the Washington National Cathedral, several Smithsonian Museums, the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum, the World War II Memorial,

memorials to Presidents Lincoln, Jefferson, Washington and Roosevelt, the National Archives, the Royal Embassy of Saudi Arabia, the Newseum and a number of other historical sites.

Take control of your account - online

n December 2012, McDonough Power introduced its Member Service Portal – designed to give members more access and control with their accounts.


You can access the portal by clicking on the "Click Here to Pay Your Bill Online" link on the cooperative's website at www.mcdonoughpower.com.

The portal offers convenience to members who want to modify their account information, sign up for alerts and reminders, or set up eBill – as well as paying their bill online.

The recent addition, within the "My Usage tab," allows members to view monthly, daily, and hourly consumption with integrated weather data.

If you're not already a user, registering to use the portal takes just a few minutes. To get started, click "NEW USER" on the home page of the Member Service Portal. If you have any problems, call or stop by the office.

Member Prizes

Every month we will have four map location numbers hidden throughout The Wire. If you find the map location number that corresponds to the one on your bill (found above the usage graph), call our office and identify your number and the page that it is on. If correct, you will win a \$10 credit on your next electric bill.



When shopping for a new appliance, consider lifetime operation costs as well as the up-front purchase price. Refrigerators last an average of 12 years, clothes washers about 11, and dishwashers about 10. Check the Energy Guide label for the appliance's estimated yearly operating cost, and look for ENERGY STAR units, which usually exceed minimum federal standards for efficiency and quality.
