Food drive a success

ore than 200 food items were donated by members and employees of Menard Electric to the Menard County Food Pantry during the month of December. All members who brought in a non-perishable food item for the pantry received a LED holiday light string courtesy of Menard Electric and Touchstone Energy.

It was a win-win situation for members, who were able to serve their community and at the same time save on their holiday lighting costs: Together We Serve and Together We Save.

Members went above and beyond, most bringing in more than the required one item donation. One man brought in five sacks of canned goods. Another woman gathered many County Market penny pincher coupons from family members that enabled her to buy several sacks full of goods.

76 member audits completed thus far through HomE Program. Rebates in process total \$39,800.

2011 health insurance plan proposal discussed in executive session.

Frasco advised that Williamsville was annexing some services currently served by MEC. He expects will have franchise agreement for approval next month.

Reviewed current results of the member installed alternative energy facilities.

Continued discussion of rate lock on CoBank loan for Prairie State

Project. Additional equity contribution for Prairie State locked in on November 5, 2010, at 3.70%.

Discussed tree trimming work being done by Travis Massey.

Co-op giving away LED lights in December to members who donate non-perishable food items for the Menard County Food Pantry.

Frasco advised the co-op was continuing with its software evaluation and that various presentations were scheduled by software vendors for evaluation.

Frasco advised center section in Illinois Country Living to be four pages full color.

Approved Veloxinet pole attachment agreement.

Adopted the amended and restated Wholesale Power Contract with Prairie Power, Inc., the amended

and restated Transmission Services Agreement, and the rescission of the Class A Member Agreement with Prairie Power, Inc.

Adopted a contract with USIC Locating Services, Inc.

Proposed 2011 financial budget discussed.

Voted to adopt a modification to Rate 31, Large Power Service and a limit on the coincident peak demand adjustment credit.

Martin and Goetsch reported on NRECA Class 939.1 that they attended.

Year to date margins were \$1,234,072 compared to \$1,294,355 a year earlier. Equity as of the end of October was 35.4% and the number of members served was 10,527 compared to 10,519 a year ago. Net utility plant was \$35,471,722 compared to \$35,373,683 last year.



Menard Electric Cooperative is sponsoring two students on the 52^{nd} annual Youth to Washington Tour, June 10-17, 2011.


