#### Rebates available HomE funds return for a limited time

The HomE program is back for a round three! The program began in 2010 with grant funding from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act program through the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity's State Energy Plan.

Our statewide association organized the project and electric coops across the state used the funds to help hundreds of members make energy efficiency improvements to their homes.

We thought HomE would be a one-time program; but its success

paved the way for a second round of funding in 2013. Now there is a third round, and we are told this will likely be the last.

HomE 3.0 rebates are available until funding runs out, or

Present were Manager Lynn Frasco, Attorney Charles Smith and Directors Gary Martin, Jay Frye, Warren Goetsch, Michael Patrick, Roy Seaney, and Steven Worner. Directors Jerry Brooks, Donald McMillan, and Jodine Tate were absent.

Doug Pettit, Senior Radio and Electronic Technician, and Brady Smith, System Engineer, presented a demonstration of new electric maps.

Chris Hinton, Manager of Accounting & Information Systems, reviewed the proposed 2015 Budget and 2015 Financial Budget Summary, with options to balance.

Under the Operations Report, Manager Frasco reported that October was the best the co-op had in recent history.

Frasco advised the ICG Contract was up for renewal in July 2015. It was consensus of the Board that Frasco be involved in those negotiations.

He reported there were seven requests for new irrigation systems; half were diesel conversions and half were new systems.

Frasco reviewed a member complaint regarding a late payment charge.

He advised RUS Loan AX8 was completed. He discussed current RUS interest rates.

Frasco advised he would be involved in negotiations related to renewing the Sherman Franchise.

Frasco advised they were working on a

third draft of the Cost of Service Study.

Frasco distributed the NRECA Executive Search Confidentiality and Non-Disclosure Acknowledgment for signature by Board members.

Frasco presented the Financial Report for the month of October. Year to date margins were \$2,063,798 compared to \$2,697,802 a year earlier. Equity as of the end of October was 37.13% and the number of member accounts served was 10,766 compared to 10,716 a year ago. Net Utility Plant at the end of October was \$42,855,308 compared to \$41,155,590 last year. The cooperative continues to meet the requirements of the RUS, FFB and NRUCFC.

#### 2015 Tree trimming

We strive to provide safe, reliable service for all our members. One way we do that is to control vegetation that could interfere with our 2,600 miles of distribution line. Contract crews attempt to clear each area once every five to six years.


This year they will perform cutting and mowing on circuits from the Middletown, Saidora, Petersburg and Barclay substations (shown on map in green). In addition, they will be applying herbicide to control undesirable vegetation regrowth on circuits from the Salisbury, Poplar City, Oakford and portions of Middletown and Saidora substations (shown on map in blue).

Single phase lines are cleared back 15 feet on either side of the lines while three phase lines are cleared back 25 feet on either side.

Smaller trees and brush are removed from under the lines to allow access and eliminate future problems. Small branches and brush will be chipped or mowed, while larger wood will be cut into manageable lengths for disposal by the member or other local parties.

Because of the size of our electric system, we ask that members keep trees trimmed around triplex service wires from the home to the utility pole. Please notify us if you wish to temporarily disconnect power while you or a contractor trims these trees. For more information call System Engineer Brady Smith.

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
