

\$1,500 scholarships available

E ight scholarships of \$1,500 each will be awarded in 2013 through the Thomas H. Moore Illinois Electric Cooperatives (IEC) Memorial Scholarship Program.

Four scholarships will be awarded to high school seniors who are the sons or daughters of an Illinois electric cooperative member receiving service from the cooperative.

The Earl W. Struck Memorial Scholarship will be awarded to a student who is the son or daughter of an Illinois electric cooperative employee.

Two scholarships are reserved for students enrolling full-time at a two-year Illinois community college who are the sons or daughters of Illinois electric cooperative members, employees or directors.

The LaVern and Nola McEntire Lineworker's Scholarship will help



pay for costs to attend the lineworker's school conducted by the Association of Illinois Electric Cooperatives in conjunction with Lincoln Land Community College, Springfield, Ill. Sons and daughters of co-op

members; relatives of co-op employees or directors; individuals enrolled in the Lincoln Land lineworker's school; and individuals who have served or are serving in the armed forces or National Guard are all eligible for the lineworker's scholarship.

Applications can be submitted electronically from our website www. menard.com or call the office at 217-632-7746. Information is also being sent to area high school guidance counselors. Deadline for the lineworker scholarship is April 30, 2013. Applications for all other scholarships are due December 31, 2012.





Board Meeting Report

Menard Electric Cooperative From the Board Room August 28, 2012

Present were Manager Lynn Frasco, Attorney Charles Smith, and Directors Gary Martin, Jerry Brooks, Michael Carls, Jay Frye, Warren Goetsch, Donald McMillan, Michael Patrick, Roy Seaney and Steven Worner.

Frasco advised the co-op was in the process of meter testing large accounts. He also said pole testing contractor and crews were testing poles.

Frasco reported on increased use of automated bill payment and electronic

bill paying service. He advised approximately 235 members signed up to pay bills with a credit card and 1,400 were paying in an automated fashion.

He discussed the Load Control Summary and advised that Menard had hit a new system peak load of 75.539 MW on July 6, 2012

Frasco reviewed a news article about Beardstown's participation in municipal aggregation.

Goetsch reported on Bylaw Policy review. Two policies were presented, reviewed and approved: Section V -

Weekly Income Accident & Sickness Benefit Plan and Section V - Use of Garage, Vehicles & Equipment.

Year to date margins were \$1,024,736 compared to \$362,725 a year earlier. Equity as of the end of June was 34.07% and the number of members served was 10,570 compared to 10,525 a year ago. Net Utility Plant at the end of July was \$38,184,093 compared to \$36,037,698 last year. The cooperative continues to meet the requirements of the RUS, FFB and NRUCFC.



As you break out your recipe cards for the upcoming holiday season keep these safety and efficiency tips in mind. The number of cooking fires doubles on Thanksgiving--keep a fire extinguisher in the kitchen, stay nearby, use a timer and wear close-fitting sleeves. To cook efficiently remember to use the right sized burner, keep burner pans shiny, defrost in the fridge, don't preheat unless baking, keep the oven door closed, turn off the heat a few minutes before the food is finished if your stove/oven is electric, and use your slow cooker, toaster oven and microwave when you can.
