



Norris Electric Cooperative returns \$856,108.25 in Capital Credits!!

It's time for you to get the credit which you deserve for helping sustain your local electric cooperative. In November, many Norris Electric members received capital credit checks when the cooperative returned capital credits for the years 1971 and 1972. If you received electric service in your name for this time period, you should have received your check, based on

how much you paid the co-op for electricity. The cooperative mailed 12,227 checks totaling \$856,108.25. You may not realize it, but when you live on cooperative lines, you become a member. In a local electric cooperative, like Norris Electric, every member owns the business.



USDA helps Norris Electric Cooperative with rural economic development

orris Electric Cooperative received a \$102,845 Rural Economic Development loan from USDA Rural Development to help finance the construction of an office and warehouse for a local seed and chemical sales business.

The Rural Economic Development Loan (REDL) program provides funding to rural projects through local utility organizations. Under the REDL program, USDA provides zero interest loans to local utilities which they, in turn, pass through to local businesses (ultimate recipients) for projects that will create and retain

employment in rural areas.

Ag Underground is constructing a 9,600-square-foot facility that will enable the business to begin hiring now and plan for future job creation over the next five years.

"Ag Underground is a locally-based and independently-owned source of agricultural inputs including seed, chemicals, and fertilizer," says Tim Bohnhoff, Member Services Coordinator for Norris Electric Cooperative. The facility will be located along Route 40 west of Greenup in Cumberland County.

You will also receive a text when your electric is restored!!)

Attention Seniors

There is still time to apply for a Norris Electric Scholarship.

Three \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded to a student who is the son or daughter of a Norris Electric Cooperative member who is currently receiving services from the cooperative at the time the scholarship application is submitted. The following rules apply:

- The applicant must be a high school senior.
- Scholarship winners must begin undergraduate studies within a year of being notified they are the recipient of the scholarship.
- Scholarship winners will be expected to be "full time" students (at least 12 hours).
- *Scholarships are for one year and are not renewable.
- Scholarships will be awarded based on grade point average, college entrance test scores, work and volunteer experience, participation in school and community activities,

biographical statement and knowledge of electric cooperatives as demonstrated by a short essay.

■ Deadline for receipt of completed applications and submissions is February 1, 2016.

Six New Year's energy resolutions

ave you made any New Year's resolutions this year? If you did it may have involved stopping a bad habit. You may have some other bad habits you're not even aware of that are costing you money! Take a look at these six resolutions that can help you save money all year long.



1. I will pull the plug. I will unplug electronics like my television, DVR, computer and video game console when not in use. I'll save even more

by unplugging battery chargers and items with digital clocks. I could save more than \$175 a year.

- 2. I will dress warmly. I won't keep my home warm like summer. I'll throw on a sweater and maybe a blanket and lower the thermostat. Just turning it from 70 to 68 degrees could save me more then \$184 a year. I'll lower the temperature even more at night or when I'm gone and save even more.
- 3. I will use my ceiling fans. I used the ceiling fans this summer to stay cool. Now I'll wipe off the dust and run them on reverse to bring the warm air down from the ceiling.
- 4. I won't waste money on laundry. I will only wash full loads of laundry

and use cold water whenever I can. I'll use the drying sensor setting on my dryer and clean the lint trap before each load.

- 5. I will wash dishes for less. I will review my dishwasher settings before pressing start, and only wash full loads. I won't use pot scrubbing or high heat unless I really need it. I'll shut off heat dry and crack open the door to finish drying the dishes.
- 6. I will choose energy-saving lighting. About 10 percent of the energy my home uses goes to lighting costs. By just replacing five of my home's most frequently used lights with energy-efficient bulbs, I could save \$75 a year in energy costs.
