

Applications are being accepted for 2012 Youth Day and Youth Tour

Rural Electric Convenience Cooperative will again sponsor up to 10 area high school juniors to attend Youth Day in Springfield to be held March 28, conducted by RECC and the Association of Illinois Electric Cooperatives. From the RECC group, two will be selected to attend the Youth To Washington trip, June 15-22, an all-expense paid tour.

Who may enter?

Youth Day in Springfield and the Youth Tour to Washington, D.C. are open to juniors at any high school within RECC's general service area. Children of RECC board of directors or employees are not eligible to win the Washington trip.

Rural Electric Youth Day

Up to 10 students will be guests of RECC at the Illinois Rural Electric Youth Day program on Wednesday,



March 28, touring the State Capitol and other historic sites, and meeting with their state legislators. After the day's activities in Springfield, the students will have individual interviews to select two winners for the trip to Washington, D.C.

Washington Tour

Our two local winners will join about 70 other students and chaperones representing other Illinois electric and telephone co-ops. They will travel by charter buses from Springfield, departing June 15 and returning June 22. Several other states will also have students participating in the tours of popular attractions such as the White House, U.S. Capitol, Smithsonian museums, and Arlington National Cemetery.

Applications are due at the RECC office by March 9. A full application kit can be requested by calling our office at 438-6197 or e-mailing us at recc@recc.coop. The 10 students selected for the Illinois Youth Day program will be notified by March 14 so that they can arrange their school schedules.
