



Government to Reward Homeowners

- \$300 for purchasing a highly efficient central air conditioner, heat pump or water heater;

- Up to \$3,400 for hybrid electric vehicles and those with advanced lean-burn diesel engines
- Up to \$4,000 for alternative fuel cars.

Businesses can receive even larger credits for energy-efficient buses and other large vehicles.

If you want to take advantage of these incentives, which will only be available for purchases made during the 2006 and 2007 tax years, you'll need to become familiar with the government's standards. That way, you'll be certain to choose items that qualify for the tax breaks.

desktop computer and monitor can consume about 65 watts per hour, according to a fact sheet published by the Energy Department in reference to its conservation program, Energy Star®. Nationally, computers in home and business settings use 32 billion kwh of electricity each year. More than half of this energy could be saved

- Enabling power standby modes can reduce consumption to 35 watts per hour.
- Turning off PCs and monitors after work can cut the annual energy costs from \$185 per computer to \$97 per computer.

Danger After A Storm

Tips to stay safe after the storm is over

s part of Severe Storm Preparedness Month in March, Safe Electricity and Corn Belt Energy caution everyone to be mindful of the electrical hazards that storms and flooding can leave in their wake. The following safety tips will help you avoid electrocution and serious injury when dealing with the aftermath of a major storm or disaster:

- 1. Stay away from downed power lines and be alert to the possibility that tree limbs or debris may hide an electrical hazard. Treat all downed or hanging power lines as if they are energized. Warn others to stay away and contact the electric utility.
- 2. If using electric yard tools in clean-up efforts, do not operate them if it's raining, the ground is wet, or while you are wet or standing in water. Keep all electric tools and equipment at least 10 feet away from wet surfaces.
- 3. Turn off electric and gas before entering flooded or damaged rooms. If you can't reach your breaker box safely, call Corn Belt Energy at (800) 879-0339 to shut off your power at the meter.
- **4.** Never step into a flooded basement or other area if water is covering electrical outlets, appliances or cords. Be alert to any electrical equipment that could be energized and in contact with water.



- **5.** Never touch electrical appliances, cords or wires while you are wet or standing in water. Have a professional check out all water damaged appliances before using them.
- **6.** If the power to your home is out for a prolonged period, know important safety rules, such as never using a charcoal or gas grill to cook inside!
- 7. Before operating a standby generator, make sure a transfer safety switch is used, or connect the appliance(s) directly to the generator output through an isolated circuit before you operate it. This prevents electricity from traveling back through the power lines, known as "back feed." Back feed creates danger for anyone near lines, particularly crews working to restore power.

When you call to report an outage, our outage system will match your phone number with your account. If you are calling from another number, you will be asked to enter the phone number where the power is out. The phone number we have listed on your account is printed on the bottom of your energy bill. If that number isn't correct, please write down the correct number and return it with your payment. We will provide information about outages on local radio stations and at our Web site, which is www.cornbeltenergy.com.

percent of your annual household electrical consumption. For VCRs, cable boxes and video games, between 70 and 90 percent of the electricity they consume takes place while they are on standby. That's because they use very little extra power when they are on, and when they are off, they are powered 24 hours a day.

Office equipment, such as computers, fax machines and copiers use large amounts of standby power to avoid warm-up times and to power clocks and soft-touch keypads.

Most standby power is lost as heat by the transformer (the power supply) converting the electricity to a lower voltage. Have you ever felt the heat coming from the adapter plug for your cordless phone? That's where the energy went.

The only way you can prevent some appliances from leaking electricity is to unplug them. It's easiest to use a power bar, and simply shut off the power to the bar. Unplug appliances that aren't being used, such as chargers for mobile phones and power tools.

Geothermal Grants Awarded

ittle Galilee Christian Assembly in Clinton was awarded a \$26,376 grant toward the completion of a geothermal heating and cooling system in its new worship and recreational center. In addition, Menno Haven Camp and Retreat Center, Tiskilwa, was awarded a \$17,285 grant for the same purpose. The grants were funded by the Illinois Clean Energy Community Foundation (ICECF) and administered by the Association of Illinois Electric Cooperatives (AIEC). Corn Belt Energy Corporation assisted Menno Haven church leaders and Little Galilee in submitting the geothermal grant applications.

Jeff Reeves, the cooperative's President/CEO, noted that geothermal technology will provide both comfort and energy savings for the facilities for many years. "Because of the energy cost savings and environmental benefits, geothermal technology is an excellent match for many of our members, both commercial and residential."

The grants are available for any facility operated by a government or non-profit organization and served by an Illinois electric cooperative. Eligible facilities, such as schools, community centers, libraries and churches, may apply for a grant of up to \$50,000 to help offset the higher initial cost of geothermal system installations.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, in a land-mark technical report entitled "Space Conditioning: The Next Frontier," calls geothermal systems "the most energy efficient, environmentally clean and cost-effective space conditioning systems available." Geothermal systems can save 50 percent in energy costs and





have been proven to decrease maintenance costs as well. Geothermal systems recover the earth's energy with loops of pipe installed underground. It is primarily the cost of installing this ground loop that creates the higher initial costs.

While use of this energy-efficient technology has grown in the residential market, it has been underutilized in institutional and commercial installations because of the higher initial costs to install.

"Facility managers and boards are sometimes tempted to move forward with the lowest initial cost alternatives, which mean less efficient, traditional systems," said John Freitag, vice president of operations for the AIEC. "Traditional systems will have increased energy usage, greater operating costs and a much greater total cost in the long run. By providing the upfront incentive, we hope to make the geothermal decision much easier."

ICECF invests in clean energy development and land preservation efforts throughout Illinois. Facilities not serviced by Illinois electric cooperatives can apply directly to ICECF for geothermal system funding. Information on ICECF's other grant programs can be found at www.illinoiscleanenergy.org.


Continuing Education for Directors

Corn Belt Energy Director Bob Whitwood of Hudson (right) spoke with N. Duane Noland, former Illinois State Senator and new President/CEO of the Association of Illinois Electric Cooperatives (AIEC), during a break in a continuing education class held at the AIEC in Springfield.

The financial decision making course is part of the Credentialed Cooperative Director Certification program established by the National Association of Rural Electric Cooperatives (NRECA). During the class, directors learned about their role in



creating and maintaining financial security for the cooperative. Noland said, "Directors make decisions that can affect the long-term financial health of the cooperative. They have learned how their decisions impact rates, capital credits and debt and equity management at the cooperative. It's all a part of learning to serve their members better."



Corn Belt Energy is purchasing its green power from a supplier that operates landfill-power generators in Indiana. These landfills produce methane, and it is used as fuel for generating electricity. It reduces our need to use more nonrenewable fossil fuels.

The Green Power Rate is one-half cent per kilowatt-hour more for the kilowatt-hours used each month. For the average residential member, that is approximately \$46 per year. That money is placed in the Green Power Fund, which is administered by the cooperative's board of directors.

ANSWERS TO ELECTRICAL SAFETY QUIZ:

1) C: All of the above.

These practices will all help decrease the risk of injury to small children. Children may see cords as toys and play with them in ways that adults would never imagine.

2) A: Replace worn extension cords with new ones.

Hiding cords or running them around doors and windows can present a serious fire hazard; it is safer to have a qualified electrician install outlets where you need them.

3) A: Unplug it, then take it to a service center.

When an electrical appliance falls into the water, first unplug it. Then, take it to a service center to make sure there is no damage that could cause injury.

4) C: Choose one based on how it will be used.

Many cords are listed by UL according to their intended use. Some are listed for "general use," which means they can be used for virtually any purpose. Ask your local hardware store dealer for help.

5) B: Unplug all appliances and have the wire checked as soon as possible.

If an electrical outlet becomes so hot that you can't leave your hand on it, you need to consult an electrician. However, keep in mind, most outlets feel a little warm after use.

6) C: Check with the manufacturer.

Check to see if your manufacturer has specified which size bulb to use. All products Listed by UL are marked with wattage ratings. If no marking is available, do not use bulbs rated more than 60 watts.

7) B: A representative sample of the product has been evaluated by Underwriters Laboratories for safety.

The UL Mark tells you that representative samples of the product have met UL's rigorous requirements for safety.

8) C: Avoid using the appliance until you can get an appropriate extension cord.

Leaving the third prong of a plug open could expose you and your family to the threat of electric shock.

9) B: Have it checked by a qualified service center before you use it again.

Even if it functions normally, you should always have damaged appliances checked by a qualified service center. Be wary of older appliances, especially if you are not familiar with their history.

10) A: Ground Fault Circuit Interrupters (GFCIs).

These devices monitor the current flowing into and out of a product. If the product is receiving more electricity than it is giving back, the GFCI immediately cuts off the current.

Annual Meeting Recap

pproximately 500 people attended Corn Belt Energy's Annual Meeting at Normal Community High School on Saturday, March 11.

Members visited with more than 20 Coop ConnectionSM business partners from 8-10 a.m., prior to the business meeting. Representatives informed members about their products and services and distributed literature.

Board Chairman Rae F. Payne reported that co-op members will not experience a rate increase in 2006, despite increased prices related to producing, transmitting and distributing power. "The pressures to hold energy rates constant are enormous. Our power supplier, Wabash Valley Power Association, as well as your cooperative, continue to look for ways to control expenses," said Payne.

Other topics discussed included:

- The \$4 million capital credit return in June 2005.
- The Touchstone Energy® Co-op Connections discount program
- Corn Belt Energy's green power rate that funds environmental projects.



- The installation of the co-op's new Automated Meter Reading (AMR) system.
- Tax credits for 2006 that have resulted from the 2005 Energy Policy Act.

President Jeffrey Reeves stated that the cooperative's financial condition is sound, despite the increased cost of purchased power caused by unusually hot weather last summer.

Secretary-Treasurer Al Hagenbuch said that members' equity in the plant increased from \$38 million to \$44 million between 2003 and 2005. "Current equity is 30 percent, and the goal is to increase our equity level to 35 percent by the year 2010. We will continue to monitor our finances and deliver the service you expect," he said. Total margins for the year were nearly \$2.7 million.

secretary-treasurer and Janice Reimer was elected assistant secretary-treasurer.

Greg Koos, a local historian, gave a very informative presentation about the historical importance of cooperatives, agriculture, transportation and business.

There were several prize drawings throughout the meeting, and Marilyn Clements of Normal won the early bird prize, a laptop computer.

Save On Your Summer Energy Bills

Switch 'N' Save* is a program that enables Corn Belt Energy to reduce the need to purchase high-priced electricity during peak periods. Members* who participate in the program receive credits on their energy bills in exchange for briefly curtaining electricity to their air conditioners and water heaters.

When outdoor temperatures soar in the summer, air conditioning puts a tremendous strain on power generating systems, creating peak demand periods.

By installing a free radio-controlled switch on or near the outside unit of your central air conditioner, Corn Belt Energy is able to "duty cycle" your compressor during peak periods. Duty cycling means the compressor will run for about eight minutes, then shut off for about seven minutes each quarter-hour. The furnace fan continues to run while the compressor is off to give the cooling effect of moving air. When the thermostat is satisfied, the air conditioner and the fan will shut off as they normally do.

When the peak period subsides, the switch will be deactivated and will remain idle until the cooperative faces another peak demand period. The switch won't be activated on weekends and holidays.

The switch is not obtrusive and cannot harm your air conditioner in any way, because it works in partnership with your in-house thermostat. The

radio signal to the switch will not cause radio or television interference.

To qualify for the credits, you must use a minimum of

400 kilowatt-hours each month. The switch must be installed before the curtailment month begins to receive the credit for that month's usage.

If you have a radio-controlled switch installed on your air conditioner, you will receive \$9.00 credits on your bills in July, August, September and October. That's a total of \$36.00 in air-conditioning credits.

When you have a radio-controlled switch installed on your electric water heater, you will also receive \$4.50 credits on your bills in July, August, September and October. That's a total of \$18.00 in water heater credits. If you have both switches, that's a total savings of \$54.00 from July through October!

Call today (800-879-0339) and see if you qualify to participate in the Switch 'N' Save Program. There's no charge for the switch or for its installation. Helping the co-op save money during peak demand periods can also save you money.

The Power to Choose Your Gas Plan

Corn Belt Energy's natural gas members can now choose the buying option that's right for them; the Winter Protection Plan or the Market-Based Plan.

1. Winter Protection Plan

Based on your historical usage, the cooperative will purchase all your gas requirements before November 1st, with the objective of protecting you from the volatility of the winter market. If you use more or less gas than was purchased on your behalf, your price per

therm will be adjusted according to market prices.

2. Market-Based Plan

Based on your historical usage, approximately 28% of your gas is purchased in the summer (per Nicor storage requirements), with the remainder purchased monthly at market prices. This plan allows you to benefit if market prices remain the same or drop during the coming months.

Whichever plan you choose, the monthly price per therm is

all inclusive. The rate is based on the average cost of gas in inventory, all balancing, storage and program fees, taxes (if applicable) and our operating margin of 5.25 cents per therm.

All current members will receive the Winter Protection Plan, unless they contact us and indicate otherwise.

Rate 113 - Campground Seasonal

Central Region Rate 11 – Usage from June 1 through September 30 is billed at a higher rate than during the other eight months of the year.

Rate 10 and Rate 19 members with separate metering for electric heat are billed at Rate 1 for usage from May 1 through September 30 (in the Central Region) and from April 21 through September 20 (in the Northern Region).

Members who participate in the Switch 'N Save Program will start receiving credits for their water heating and air conditioning usage from June through September. *Currently, this program is only available in the Central Region*. Stay Safe When Lightning Strikes

ightning causes more storm-related deaths annually in the United States than tornadoes or hurricanes and causes about \$5 billion in economic losses each year.

During National Lightning Safety Awareness Week in June, Corn Belt Energy and Safe Electricity offer safety tips and precautions recommended by the National Weather Service to avoid injury and damage during thunderstorm and lightning activity.

Under the '30-30 rule,' if you are outside when a storm approaches and you see lightning, count the time until you hear thunder. If you count 30 seconds or less, seek proper shelter. Wait at least 30 minutes after the last observed lightning or thunder before leaving shelter.

Stay Inside

"If thunderstorms and lightning are approaching, the safest location is indoors away from doors and windows," says Molly Hall, Director of the Safe Electricity program.

- ♦ Use only cordless or cell phones to make emergency calls.
- ◆ Turn off and unplug appliances well before a storm nears never during.
- Stay away from electrical outlets, appliances, computers, power tools and TV sets. Take off headsets and stop playing video games.
- ♦ Avoid water and contact with piping, including sinks, baths and faucets. Don't wash dishes, shower or bathe during a thunderstorm. Also avoid washers and dryers since they not only connect with the plumbing and electrical systems, but also contain an electrical path from the outside through the dryer vent.
- ◆ Do not lie on the concrete floor of a garage as it likely contains a wire mesh.

• Basements typically are a safe place to go during thunderstorms, but avoid concrete walls that may contain metal rebar.

If You're Caught Outdoors

"If you're in an open area outside, tingling skin or crackling sounds could signal that lightning is about to strike," warns Hall. "Drop down into a crouching position and make yourself as small as possible - feet together and hands over your ears - with minimal contact with the ground."

- ♦ Move to a safer location such as vehicle with a solid, metal roof. Close the windows and avoid contact with electrical conducting paths, such as the steering wheel, ignition, gear shifter or radio.
- Avoid water, high ground and open spaces. Do not seek shelter under tall, solitary trees; canopies; small picnic or rain shelters; or in any open-frame vehicles such as jeeps, convertibles, golf carts, tractors or mowers.
- ♦ Do not stand near power, light or flag poles, machinery, fences, gates, metal bleachers, or even other people. Spread out at least 20 feet apart from each other. Move to low ground and seek cover in clumps of bushes, or trees of uniform height, such as a forest.




(Top) CBEC Manager of Member Services Jerry Durflinger (left) discusses the metering installations necessary for the electric heat rate with Dr. Koe.

Green Power Rate Available

Besides supplying green power to consumers who opt for it, the program will raise funds for environmental projects in the Corn Belt Energy service area.



Fuel Costs





You may assume that when you're away from home, your electric bill should drop significantly. Frequently members call us following vacation and insist that there must be something wrong with their meters. After all, they were gone for part of the month and turned off the air conditioning before leaving home.

Rarely is anything wrong with the meter. Consumers often

forget that many appliances in their homes operate automatically, whether they're at home or not.

Refrigerators and freezers are big electric users. Especially, if they are older models, are located in areas that aren't cooled, or have an accumulation of dust on the coils. During the summer, an old refrigerator can account for as much as 25 percent of the monthly electric bill. Even models purchased five years ago consume more than those manufactured today.

Keep in mind it also costs more to operate refrigerators and freezers that are only partially filled. Did you empty your refrigerator before you left home, or do you have an old refrigerator in your garage or basement that's only used occasionally or to keep beverages cold?

If you shut off the air conditioner before you left

home, the warmer house caused the refrigeration equipment to run longer. Other automatic conveniences such as dehumidifiers, waterbed heaters, sump pumps, battery-powered appliances with charges, instant-on TVs, water heaters, clocks, security light, cable TV boxes, etc. operate automatically and contribute to the usage and to the bill.

Plus, when you returned from vacation, you probably

turned on the air conditioning, which had to work hard to cool down the house and draw humidity from the air. Then you were probably busy restocking the refrigerator, washing and drying clothes, ironing, bathing, cooking, etc. Even though some kilowatt-hours may have been saved while you were away, you may have used them when you returned – and maybe even more.



Safety training is one of the most important skills that the co-op provides.


Employees are instructed in CPR, first aid, rescue techniques, hazard recognition and fire prevention and extinguishers. Much of this training is required by the Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHA).

In addition, line crews attend "schools," which can last from one day to one week. Training schools such as hotline, forestry, chainsaw safety, underground and substation keep linemen upto-date on new technology, safety equipment and work practices.

Front office personnel also have specific training regarding

computer skills. The ability to easily locate correct information for members is a top priority for our customer service representatives and the engineering department staff.

Corn Belt invests in new technology and staff training to better serve you. Employee training is essential for the safe and efficient operation of your cooperative.



Green Power Rate Available

Purchasing environmentally conscious "green power" is now an option for Corn Belt Energy members.

"Green Power" is electricity generated from the wind, sun or biomass. Corn Belt Energy is purchasing its green power from a supplier that operates landfill-power generators in Indiana. These landfills produce methane, which is used to generate electricity. This reduces our need to use more non-renewable fossil fuels.

Besides supplying green power to consumers who opt for it, the program will raise funds for environmen-

tal projects in the Corn Belt Energy service area.

Members on the Green Power Rate pay $\frac{1}{2}$ cent more per kilowatt-hour for their usage each month. For the average residential member, that's approximately \$46 per year.

Corn Belt Energy's Board of Directors administers the Green Power Funds. These funds will assist in financing local environmental projects such as the proposed wind generators at the Illinois State University farm.

Electric Generation

Electricity Generation in 2005 increased 1.7 percent, compared to 2004.

Nuclear power generation was down 1 percent and hydroelectric power production fell by 1.2 percent, federal figures show.

The slack was picked up by natural gas-fired generation, which was up 6 percent, and coal-fired generation, up 1.8 percent, according to the U.S. Energy Information Administration.

Utilities produced roughly two-thirds of the electricity generated last year, while independent power producers produced the balance.

Technology pervades Corn Belt Energy



echnology is a part of every department at Corn Belt Energy and the coop is also on the brink of many new technological advances that will improve our relationship with member owners from advances in billing to building security to Global Positioning System (GPS) "in the field" and everything in between.

"We're always looking at new technology," said Bob Fischbach, manager of accounting and Information services.

Computers first appeared in the building in 1976 in the form of one terminal in the billing department. Data was stored on

cassette tapes that were transmitted over the telephone lines to a large, bulky mainframe system in St. Peters, MO. That computer generated the bills and shipped them back to the Bloomington office to mail.

Today, many computerization generations later, Corn Belt still works with the same provider, now called National Information Solutions Corporation (NISC), still headquartered in the same city. They develop much of the billing/accounting and outage software used by Corn Belt Energy.

In 1980 that first terminal was replaced with three online terminals and data was

stored on eight-inch "floppy" disks. Information was transmitted once a day. Customer Service Representatives were excited when they could look up information themselves – there was two-way communication between NISC and Corn Belt for the first time.

Personal computers

A technological milestone was achieved in 1985 when the first personal computer (pc) made its appearance on the desk of the executive assistant – a Digital Rainbow "pc" used mostly for word processing. It had a monochrome screen, 64K of memory, no hard drive and ran on a CPM operating system.


But around 1990 International Business Machine (IBM) pc's began showing up on many desks in the cooperative. NISC was using a satellite system on dedicated service terminals and for the first time – live data transmission but the processor was still a large mainframe computer. Corn Belt Energy acknowledged the role of computers in the coop by hiring the first full time Information Technology (IT) employee.

Five years later Corn Belt Energy boasted its first in-house processors – employees had pc's that did their own processing, connected to the first network, instead of terminals connected to a mainframe.

Steve Coppenbarger, the current Information Systems Director, started in July 2000. "Technological progress has provided us with more efficient means to better serve our members," Coppenbarger said.

Corn Belt Energy had the opportunity to move to a new building in the Central Region, complete with high-end wiring and other considerations for technology. The coop moved in January, 2002.

Going paperless



industrial standard). Also the software was date sensitive - allowing us to store data by date and run reports by date. Corn Belt is also moving closer to being paperless. Many functions of the coop from timecards to letterhead are done on computers now. In fact every important record is being scanned and stored and accessed via

computer. The program also cross references the data. All company files are meticulously backed up off site. Even paper work orders may soon be a thing of the past as they are computerized and software helps match equipment and manpower and scheduling for the work order.

CAD and GPS

Meanwhile technology was changing and improving other departments in the coop. The Engineering Department began using Computer Aided Drafting (CAD) in 1993. Another program that sends and receives data about electrical loads is Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA). When Corn Belt Energy began contracting with Wabash Valley for electricity, they were introduced to Open Systems International (OSI). OSI monitors all of Corn Belt's substations – checking for kilowatt usage, checking breakers and transmission lines and monitoring amperage on phases and load control. When something goes wrong, employees take a laptop and plug it into a regulator and gather data to help them analyze the problem.

The newest leap in technology is the use of Global Positioning Systems (GPS). Corn Belt Energy is locating all of their poles, meters, lines, transformers, breakers, etc. Servicemen can be dispatched for maintenance or repairs based on GPS locations which they can find using a laptop in their truck. Engineering will also be using tablet computers in the field to design and stakes lines for new construction projects using GPS. Our Northern Region paved the way and is already using this technology.

Outages

Perhaps no where does technology provide better service for member owners than in the Operations Department. Phone technology is meshed with computer technology to not only let Operations know that your power is out when you call in from a phone number associated with your map location (this can be a home, cell phone etc. as long as it is entered in your customer information) but also recognizes if they are from a particular geographic area so linemen know everyone beyond a circuit breaker or transformer is probably out of power. It also works with our after hours dispatch center. This technology is continuing to explode and soon members may be able to view outage maps on our website.

One of our linemen has been serving as a test model for several years. He carries a laptop containing electronic maps of his territory and customers information including what equipment they have so he can bring the correct breaker or transformer that may be needed for the repair. Soon, all trucks will have this technology.

Automatic Meter Reading

Another exciting technological advance closely associated with members is Automatic Meter Reading (AMR). Many members' meters are already changed out and the usage is being transmitted through the power lines themselves to the substation where a radio signal sends it the office for eventual billing.

Corn Belt Energy's buildings are all monitored and videotaped via computerization.

New web site design

Member owners are already using www.corn-beltenergy.com in greater and greater numbers. Corn Belt has contracted with a cutting edge web development company to revamp our web site. Watch for the unveiling late in 2006. The process used to gather new ideas for the site should assure a design that is comprehensive, user-friendly and exciting to look at and use. Bookmark it in your "favorites."

"We're poised for the future with technology," said Todd Sovich, CAD operator.

Test Your Electrical Savvy With This Quick Quiz

ost people know only as much about electricity as much about electricity as their daily lives; in other words, not very much. A little knowledge can help prevent a shock, make your home safer, and save you money on your power bill. Here are a handful of true/false questions from the Leviton Institute to test your Electrical IQ:

- It's cheaper to leave fluorescent lights on when exiting a room than it is to turn them back on when you return.
- 2. House wiring never needs replacing.
- 3. A circuit breaker is not designed to protect against a ground fault.
- 4. A two-parter: Computer screen savers save energy, and your computer will last longer if you leave it on all day, instead of shutting it off when you're not using it.
- 5. You can damage a power tool by using the wrong size extension cord.



ANSWERS

- 1. False. This is a commonly held belief, based on the erroneous notion that fluorescent bulbs use a lot of power to get started. While it is true that a compact fluorescent bulb does require a brief surge when switched on, it works out to be around the same amount of energy as five seconds of normal use, according to the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). So turning the lights off for more than five seconds will save more energy than leaving them on.
- **2. False.** Depending on the amount of use, insulation on house wires can become frayed or broken, creating a fire hazard. If you have any doubts about your wiring, have a qualified electrician perform a complete in-
- spection. Houses built between 1965 and 1973, in particular, are at risk because many were built with aluminum wiring, which the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission says is 55 times more likely to reach "fire hazard conditions" than regular copper wire.
- **3. TPUB.** Circuit breakers are designed to protect against high levels of electrical current caused by a short circuit. Ground Fault Circuit Interrupters (GFCIs) protect against ground faults, when current leaking from an appliance goes to ground through a person touching the appliance. Even a small amount of current passing through a person this way can be lethal; a GFCI will trip if there's a ground fault, whereas a circuit breaker won't.
- **4. False and False.** Screen savers only save screens, not energy. If you want to save energy, turn the monitor off. In fact, the EPA recommends you turn the computer off, too, if you aren't going to use it within a half hour. They claim the lifetime of the hard disc is limited by use, rather than start-ups.
- **5. TPUG.** If your electric lawn mower, hedge trimmer or leaf blower doesn't get enough power, either because the extension cord is too thin or too long to deliver it, it can damage and eventually destroy the motor. Also, overloading an extension cord can cause a fire or shock hazard.



onsolidated Grain and Barge Co., located along • the Illinois River near Hennepin, was a busy place
 in late July (when these photographs were taken) with semi trucks of grain lining the driveway waiting their turn on the scales. But in the fall the pace picks up even more with newly harvested corn, soybeans and wheat arriving by semis from inland grain elevators, smaller trucks and even a few tractors pulling wagons from area farms. And at same time grain is leaving via giant river barges. The barges head to Louisiana where grain is exported by cargo ships.

Storage capacity at the Hennepin site is two million bushels. Grain moves in and out of the facility year-round. One of the challenges is to handle a lot of specialty grain which must be tracked and stored separately with no co-mingling.

Some grain is dried to the proper moisture level for storage and some moves in and out of the facility without further drying.

Adding to the flurry of physical activity is the large room filled with grain marketing representatives selling grain for individuals and the company as the prices rise and fall at the Chicago Board of Trade. And the bookkeepers are pouring over scale ticket information accounting for every incoming, outgoing and stored bushel and who owns it. They also write the checks to the customers after they sell grain.

Watching over this flurry of activity is Jim Hamacher, regional operations manager. Hamacher stresses safety at all of Consolidated Grain's locations. His goal is zero accidents and he has seen the accident rate drop 78 percent.

Consolidated Grain and Barge Co. began in 1970 and is now divided into four regions with 20 elevators in the Northern Illinois Region. There are river terminals in East Dubuque, Sayanna,

Peru and Utica as well as the main office and river terminal at Hennepin. With all those facilities the company is always planning and conducting capital improvement projects, updates, expansion and repairs. Consolidated Grain also has a connection with railroads. The site at Freeport loads grain into rail cars. They have several locations that have the capability to fill shipping containers that go by rail to the coast where they are loaded onto ships for export. The company also has its own trucking division which leases trucks.

One of the keys to success at Consolidated is diversification. Since the company owns the equipment for loading and unloading barges they also handle products other than grain including coke, fertilizer and a product used as a conditioner for baseball fields.

Consolidated Grain and Barge Co. is a Corn Belt Energy Corporation member/owner.

october is National Co-op Month, a time to celebrate the cooperative way of doing business. Cooperatives are formed to benefit the people who are served by them. Cooperatives are owned by the members, so the priority becomes the service of the members, not profit.

Because the members own the company, they have a voice in how the company is run. They elect the board of directors, the guiding body of the cooperative, and they are invited to meetings to hear the important issues and news related to the co-op. The co-op also sends members newsletters and other communication to keep them informed.

Member-owned also means locally-owned, so co-ops have a vested interest in the communities they serve. If members have questions or concerns, they can contact the cooperative locally to voice their opinions. And co-op employees are often very active in their communities.

Did you know that ...?

Ben Franklin formed the first successful cooperative in 1752.

Cooperatives are owned by the members they serve.

- Toad Lane in England is considered the birthplace of the modern cooperative because many of the principles that guide cooperatives were formed there in 1844.
- Cooperatives are guided by seven internationally recognized principles: voluntary and open membership; democratic member control; member economic participation; autonomy and independence; education, training, and information; cooperation among cooperatives; and concern for the communities they serve.

- Cooperatives are formed by producers to sell their products, by workers who own and operate the company they work for, by consumers who use a service or product, and by small business owners and municipalities to share purchases of goods and services in order to increase their purchasing power.
- Electric cooperatives provide electric service to the member-owners at the cost of service. The members share any profit either through investment in the company or by credit to the member-owners.
- Electric cooperatives own 2.4 million miles or 43 percent of the nation's electric distribution lines and deliver 10 percent of the total kilowatt-hours in the United States annually.
- Electric cooperatives serve 12 percent of the population in the United States and employ 63,000 people.
- Land O Lakes, Ocean Spray, and Sunkist brands are all produced by cooperatives.
- Ace Hardware and True Value are owned and operated by cooperatives.

Corn Belt Energy supplies Grand Bear Resort

Grizzly Jack's Grand Bear Resort in rural Utica – an indoor water park, amusement park, hotel, cluster of restaurants and more - is serviced by Corn Belt Energy Corporation.

Opened on July 1, 2005, the resort was designed by the owners and is the only one of its



kind in the United States. The resort is located on property adjacent to Starved Rock State Park. It features 92 rooms of five different types with unique layouts from bunk bed rooms to Jacuzzi suites with king-size beds. But investors own neighboring 1,800-square-foot villas that sleep 10 and 2,800-square-foot cabins that sleep 18. Villas and cabins feature full kitchens and are rented out to guests when the investors are not using them.

The "b" word (boredom) is probably not heard much around Grizzly Jack's. For starters if you are hungry or thirsty you can choose from five different restaurant venues. There's a pizza parlor, the Honey Pot ice cream and fudge shop, the Grizzly Bean Café coffee shop, Grizzly Jack's Place - a full service restaurant and Jack's Bar, a bar and grill for adults.

Need an item from a convenience store? No need to leave the property - Grand Bear Resort has its own store, and a gift shop.

The centerpiece of the resort is no doubt the indoor water park - a first for Illinois. It features an interactive water slide with visual effects, one of only two in

the world, and attractions such as the body slide, Lazy River, wave pool and dumping bucket.

The Cave Arcade is 3,600 square feet of video games and includes Canyon Creek, an 18-hole indoor miniature golf course. There's also a playground for children, Castle in the Woods.

And across the parking lot is the Enchanted Forest a 40,000-square-foot indoor amusement park featuring rides such as bumper cars and Tilt-a-Whirl. A special ride is Eclipse rated at "4 Gs" which is the only one in the United States and one of only three in the world.

Surprise visitors at the Enchanted Forest have included live wild animals such as bear, lion and tiger cubs.

And if you want a unique way of traveling between the villas and cabins and the amusement park or main lodge try the resort's train, which



provides free shuttle services to guests.

The resort is also home to many conventions and business meetings with more than 6,000 square feet of meeting space. Banquet facilities for wedding receptions and other events are also popular.

In keeping with the theme of never saying the "b" word is an activity area with supervised arts and crafts projects. Or hang out in the soaring lobby and Grizzly Jack and Grand Bear will come alive and tell you a bedtime story.

Grand Bear attracts many visitors from the

Midwest - especially the Chicago area. Theme weekends are popular.

The resort covers 60 acres and also boasts a natural 100-foot ravine and waterfall. An outdoor pool is almost complete. Check out the fun at www.grizzlyjacksresort.com.

Students encouraged to apply for 2007 IEC Memorial Scholarships

Jeffrey Reeves has announced that for the twelfth consecutive year the Illinois electric cooperatives will award academic scholarships to high school seniors. Five scholarships in 2007 will be awarded through the Illinois Electric Cooperative (IEC) Memorial Scholarship Program. Each of the scholarships will be worth \$1,250.

High school seniors pursuing a college education are eligible to participate in the program. Three of the five scholarships will be awarded to the son or daughter of an electric cooperative member. A fourth award will go to the son or daughter of an electric cooperative director or employee. A fifth scholarship will be reserved for use at a two-year Illinois community college, and sons and daughters of electric cooperative members, employees and directors are all eligible. Deadline for applications to be returned to the cooperative is Jan. 1, 2007.

"The purpose of the scholarship program is to assist electric cooperative youth while honoring past rural electric leaders through memorial gifts," said Reeves. "Corn Belt and the other Illinois electric cooperatives want to make a difference in their communities. One of the best ways we can do that is by lending a hand to our youth. With the cost of tuition and books going up scholarships like this one can help."

Candidates are judged on the basis of grade point average, college entrance exam scores, work and volunteer experience, school and civic activities, and a short essay which demonstrates their knowledge of electric cooperatives.





he Corn Belt Energy service territory near Walnut boasts slightly rolling fields producing corn, soybeans, hay and the Sunset Ridge MX track where motorcycle racing enthusiasts gather on weekends from March through November to test their metal.

The track is the dream of CBEC members Bob and Jan Pistole who built the facility on the family farm and live in a new house adjacent to it. Brother Gary lives on the family farmstead a stone's throw away.

Sunset Ridge debuted in 2000 with five events. They now host 10 race weekends a year to comply with zoning. Races feature four-wheelers and "dirt bike" motorcycles ranging from 50 ccs up to 500 ccs. Riders range in age from four years old to 60. Classes are separated by age, size of bike and skill level.

A competitor can race in three events in a day if eligible. Racers are scored on where they cross the finish line, the fastest five to seven laps is common.

A national all terrain vehicle (ATV) event this summer drew 600 entrants and was televised by Outdoor Life Network on cable.

Open rides are fun and help racers learn the course for future events. Sunset Ridge is a closed course that can run one to two miles with lots of jumps and obstacles.

Bob and Jan stress safety. Racers wear helmets, protective suits and boots. When Jan isn't helping with race weekends she is a flight and emergency room nurse at the hospitals in Princeton and Dixon. She also teaches paramedics at Sauk Valley College. They own their own ambulance and have licensed emergency medical technicians at every event.

Bob designed all the jumps with safety in mind for dirt bikes and ATVs.

Motocross is family-based sport. Many families camp at the track for the weekend.

Like farming, weather plays a big role in the sport. Too much rain can cause cancellation of an entire event. If the Pistoles cancel before any event starts, the race can be re-scheduled.

Sunset Ridge is in District 17, which includes 11 tracks and most of the state of Illinois.

Bob used to race bikes and eventually graduated to stock cars, but has now retired and is back to dirt bikes.

Jan manages the business and oversees registration, ordering trophies and keeping track of scoring. On a race weekend 10 to 15 people help in the office and eight to 10 people help with track maintenance. They also sell food and t-shirts.

Jan and Bob are the parents of Josh, who lives nearby, and Chad, who lives in Ohio, IL. The four make up the corporation of 4P Promotions Inc., which owns and operates Sunset Ridge MX. There are five grandchildren, three grandsons and two granddaughters. The grandsons are now getting involved in racing.



Electrical substations are highly complex operations. Large amounts of power are transmitted through these locations. Most often voltage is stepped down in order to safely transmit energy to individual members.

Safety training is a key component to the cooperative's continuing education program for all employees. Line staff review procedures and interact with instructors a number of times each year.

Be safe and sparkling this holiday season

We want your holiday season to sparkle. Glowing Christmas tree lights and festively decorated houses are magical parts of the season. Stay safe by remembering the following tips:

- ♦ If you choose a real tree, keep it watered
- ♦ Use only Underwriters Laboratory (UL) approved lights that are in good condition.
- ♦ Place extension cords out of traffic and not under rugs.
- ♦ Unplug lights before you go to bed.
- ♦ Keep an eye on candles and blow them out at bedtime

If you decorate the outside, use only lights rated for outdoor use.

- ♦ Keep cords off walkways.
- ♦ Use portable ground fault circuit interrupter (GFCI) outlets to protect you and your family from shock.
- ♦ Make sure you don't overload your electric circuits, a major cause of electrical fire.
- ♦ If you must use extension cords, use heavy duty ones.
