HAVEN'T DOWNLOADED OUR MyMEC APP YET?

Reason #1:

I haven't had an outage recently

When a summer storm hits and your power is out might not be the best time to download and set up a new app. Most power outages don't happen at convenient times; download the app now before you need it. You can use the app to report outages, check our outage map if you're away from home to see if your area has outage reports, and more.

Reason #2:

I don't need it

If you like calling in your outage, you are certainly welcome to continue doing so. But during large outages, our

members sometimes get a busy signal, and we know how frustrating that can be. A few clicks on the MyMEC app and you'll know we are aware of your outage. It will often be faster and more convenient than a phone call. It's the quickest way to get outage information to our crews out in the field.

We encourage all of our members who use a smartphone or tablet to download and give the app a try.

Reason #3:

I don't know how

Search for Menard Outage in the Google Play or App store on your mobile phone or tablet. You'll find the MyMEC App available for a free download. We
