"You forget how nice we have it here until you go out and see what other people actually have," Ryan said. "When a little boy told me he was no longer scared at night because he had lights, that really summed everything up for me." Both Joe and Ryan said they were grateful to be able to use their skills to give back to those in need and appreciate receiving the award recognizing their efforts.

The trip was sponsored by AIEC and managed and coordinated by NRECA International. NRECA International, an affiliate of the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association (NRECA) has been working in developing countries since 1962.

Today more than 300 member electric cooperatives support its work through monetary contributions, material donations, and sending hundreds of electric co-op linemen and employees abroad as volunteers. NRECA International volunteers work with local co-ops and their communities in developing countries to build and upgrade power lines, offer training and mentor local staff on how to successfully run a utility.

The 2018 Youth Tour delegates representing Illinois Electric were: Blake Clayton of Winchester, Geoffery Giles of Pleasant Hill, Lydia Lansaw of Greenfield and Iva Welbourne of Pittsfield.

The students toured Capitol Hill and met with U.S. Senator Dick Durbin, Congressman Rodney Davis and Congressman Darin LaHood. They also visited historical and cultural sites including Arlington National Cemetery, the Supreme Court, Newseum, Royal Embassy of Saudi Arabia, a variety of memorials and the U.S. Capitol. Among fun activities the students enjoyed were the Marine Corps Sunset Parade, the Smithsonian Museums and an assembly of Youth Tour participants from across the nation.

It is important to have a current number in our system so that we are able to reach you in the case of an emergency.


