About the scholarships



Energy efficiency ideas to help reduce your winter heating bill

It's time to get serious about the Lapproaching winter weather. We all have areas that can be improved in our homes to reduce winter heating bills and provide better comfort. Here are some ideas that you can use before frosty temperatures arrive.

- 1. Keep the cold air out and the warm air in. Caulk and weatherstrip around windows and doors to eliminate air leaks. Seal gaps in floors, walls, around pipes and electrical wiring. Close any vent to your basement or crawl space. Make sure your attic insulation covers all of the heated ceiling space, with at least eight inches of insulation depending on the material used.
- 2. Check or replace your heating system. Change your air filters regularly, and make sure they are facing in the correct position for the airflow. Fix any broken or disconnected ducts, and seal joints and connections with mastic (not duct tape). If your heating system is over 15 years old, consider a replacement with a more efficient model. If you have a propane or gas furnace and an older air conditioner, replace the AC with a heat pump for better efficiency in both winter and summer.
- 3. Minimize the use of plug-in heaters. No matter what the advertisements say, there is no "miracle" heater. Typically, a portable heater will use 1,5000 watts of power, which could cost 18 cents per hour to run. That doesn't sound so bad, but it could add up to more than \$4/day and over \$120/month if running continuously! Think about ways to keep an area comfortable without adding an extra heat source (see items 1 and 2 above).
- 4. Make minor lifestyle changes. During the day, let the sunshine in by opening shades and drapes. Close them at night to retain the heat. Turn off lights, electronics and computers

- when you don't need them. Unplug that extra refrigerator in your garage or basement if it's not stocked with food.
- 5. Ask us for helpful booklets on energyefficient construction methods, evaluating appliance energy use, and no-cost energy saving tips. And, sign up for our free SmartHub app to see your daily energy use online!
