Megan Vogt wins IEC **Scholarship!**



The Monroe County Electric Cooperative board of directors presented Megan Vogt the Thomas H. Moore Illinois Electric Cooperative Memorial Scholarship during the June board meeting.

Megan Vogt of rural Fults was one of 12 winners, statewide, of this year's Thomas H. Moore Illinois Electric Cooperatives (IEC) Memorial Scholarship. She is the daughter of Monroe County Electric Cooperative (MCEC) members Tom and Tammy Vogt.

She competed for the scholarship with a record number of 252 other student applicants from across the state, which includes 23 other electric cooperatives. There were 13 total submissions from our cooperative. The \$2,000 scholarships are awarded each year to 11 sons or daughters of electric cooperative members, and one who is planning on attending lineworker's school at Lincoln Land Community College in Springfield, conducted by the Association of Illinois Electric Cooperatives.

Megan plans on attending Southern Illinois University of Edwardsville to major in nursing and minor in Spanish.

Candidates' applications were judged on grade point average, college entrance exam scores, work and volunteer experience, school and civic activities and an essay demonstrating their knowledge of electric cooperatives, namely her local

cooperative, MCEC.

Alan Wattles, MCEC president/ CEO, said, "The employees and board members of MCEC have always been involved in our local schools and communities. We live here too and, like our members, have a vested interest in the future of our children. This scholarship is just a small way we can help make a difference for a student like Megan Vogt, and we congratulate her!" "We have not had a winner of an IEC Scholarship since 2011, so we are very excited for Megan," Wattles added.

In place of the Washington trip, the cooperative board of directors elected to award Hope a scholarship for \$1,500 that will be used for her to attend St. Louis University in the fall.


