EnerStar Electric Cooperative is a democratically controlled, not-for-profit electric co-op that is governed by nine directors elected by and from the members of their respective voting districts. Directors serve a **One Member**  **One Vote** three-year term in office.

Active cooperative members voted in June for fellow members they wish to serve on the board of directors. Kevin Julian of Metcalf in Voting District A and Jeremy Williams of Martinsville in Voting District C each ran unopposed and were re-elected to the

co-op board. Newly elected to the co-op board is Darin Griffin of Paris who will serve in Voting District B.

Serving as election inspectors were Pat Macke of Marshall, Tom Phillips of Chrisman and Ray Young of Paris. Assisting with the election count was cooperative attorney Billie Constant of Tapella & Eberspacher LLC, the co-op's corporate counsel.

We thank those members who are willing to serve on the board. It's a considerable task and we appreciate their service!

Upcoming annual meeting news

EnerStar CEO Brent Reyher announced that since the Illinois governor's Restore Illinois Plan and state mandates that limited the size of gatherings have been lifted, plans are underway for the upcoming 2021 annual meeting of members.

This year's annual meeting will be held on Thursday, September 9, 2021, at the Paris High School campus. An evening meal will be served in the school's cafeteria from 4:30 p.m. to 6 p.m., followed by a business meeting at 6:30 p.m. to be conducted in the Paris Center of Fine

Arts (PCOFA), attached to the high school.

For those not familiar with this facility, the PCOFA is a state-of-the-art performing arts venue that is well-suited for a cooperative annual meeting. The school and the 500-plus seat theatre were opened in 2015 and are both served by EnerStar.

Call To Action: EnerStar Electric Cooperative Members

Continued pressure is being placed on utilities by state legislators to close coal-fired power plants. **Under the Illinois legislative energy proposal, Prairie State Energy Campus in Marissa, Illinois will be required to close by 2035, possibly sooner.**

Prairie State Energy Campus is owned by many Midwest not-for-profit electric cooperatives and municipalities, including EnerStar Electric Cooperative's energy supplier, Wabash Valley Power. Plans for Prairie State began in 2002 and it became fully operational in 2012. It was built with the highest clean-energy standards and uses state-of-the-art environmental controls and technology. It will likely be the last coal-fired power plant built in Illinois.

Today, Prairie State Energy Campus is only 10 years old. In 2035, cooperative owners will still have outstanding loans of \$188 million on this plant. **Closure of this plant will make Illinois dependent on neighboring states for replacement energy. The loans, plus the cost of replacement energy, could result in 20-25% increases to YOUR utility bills.**

EnerStar Electric Cooperative is committed to keeping energy affordable and reliable while we invest in a cleaner energy future, but we cannot let policy get ahead of technology. Current technology needs to be improved and expanded upon before we can reliably power the grid with carbon-free resources.

Help send the message to Governor Pritzker and state legislators that any legislation proposed must provide a delayed closure date for Prairie State and allow not-for-profit owners to pay off their debt on these new facilities.

We oppose legislation that:

- ✓ reduces grid reliability
- ✓ makes us dependent on neighboring states for energy generation
- ✓ moves good-paying energy jobs and tax base to neighboring states
- ✓ potentially increases our rates by 20% to 25%

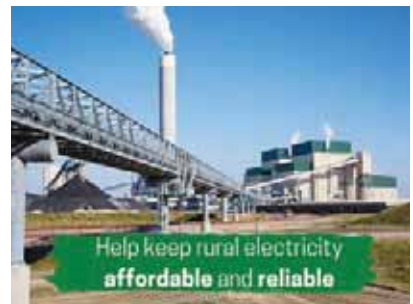

EnerStar concludes first-ever aerial tree trimming project

In a continued effort to improve system reliability, EnerStar recently concluded a vegetation management practice with a technique that is new to us. The co-op contracted Aerial Solutions, Inc. (ASI), and their services helped us reach heights previously unattainable with the co-op's equipment.

ASI trimmed trees in challenging areas from above, utilizing an aerial power saw suspended from a helicopter. The equipment is capable of efficiently cutting vegetation along and above the power lines.

Key areas targeted in the EnerStar service territory included southern Edgar County and northern Clark County. According to EnerStar CEO Brent Reyher, "The



EnerStar and ASI crews worked extremely well together, making notable progress across all of the targeted trimming areas with only minimal outages. We appreciate the member's patience as we worked through this for the first time."

Reyher went on to say, "Having the vegetation removed from areas

that we could not easily reach with our existing equipment should yield benefits for a number of years. Given that this was such a positive experience, we are now evaluating how best to utilize the aerial saw as an on-going complement to our in-house vegetation efforts."



Ferrell transformer

Out with the old in with the new! EnerStar crews recently replaced a large transformer at its Ferrell substation in southern Edgar County. The co-op has been evaluating the transformer on a regular basis and field tests indicated it could fail in the near future. While the co-op can back-feed substations quickly, that option is a temporary fix. And purchasing new transformers of that size is anything but quick with delivery times being several months. To be proactive, EnerStar purchased a new unit available from our wholesale power provider, Wabash Valley Power. This is just one of the many benefits of belonging to Wabash!
