co-op staff, directors and its membership are family," he said.

Board member Jim Freeman gave the treasurer's report, announcing that the coop is in strong financial shape again this year, and highlighted the fact that the co-op was able to again retire approximately \$1 million in capital credits to current and former members during the past year. Freeman assured the membership that all is being done to mitigate rate increases.

General Manager Randy Long addressed the membership to discuss the electric system, focusing mostly on the reliability of the grid, amid the possibility of rolling blackouts in this part of the country. Long spoke on the next steps in the future with the closure of coal-fired generation plants.

"At the moment, we have enough capacity, most of the time," Long explained. "The risk of blackouts will increase with each closure of these power plants. This is why it is important to stay engaged and continue to make our voices heard through legislative efforts such as the Voices for Cooperative Power Campaign."

Members helped to impact the legislation that helped prevent the premature closure of the Prairie State Plant with more than 1,800 letters of support during the co-ops' call for action last fall. Long also encouraged the membership to sign up for text messaging alerts to be notified of any system shut down notices.

Four seats on the board of directors were up for election. Kristine Bingham, District 2; Pat Stendback, District 4; Bryan Hubbert, District 6; and Tom Meehan, District 8, were all re-elected for a 3-year term.

Throughout the duration of the meeting, prizes were handed out. Four lucky members won \$500, 20 received \$100 and \$500 were donated to 11 members' favorite charities.

From everyone at the co-op, we'd like to thank everyone that made it out to this year's meeting. It was great to see so many familiar faces and we look forward to seeing you again next year.


