## Just the 'Coal' Hard Facts

- Coal lies beneath approximately 65% of Illinois.
- According to the Illinois State Geological Survey, there is more than 100 billion tons of recoverable coal in Illinois.
- Illinois has almost 25% and the largest percentage of bituminous coal reserves in the United States.
- At the present rate of consumption, Illinois has enough coal supply to meet the coal demand of the United States for the next 100 years.
- Coal accounts for 47.1% of the electricity generated in Illinois.
- Coal generated electricity is one-half the cost of natural gas generated electricity and onefourth the cost of wind generated electricity.
- The Illinois coal industry is responsible for approximately 3,500 Illinois jobs and another 12,000 jobs are dependent on the Illinois coal industry including transportation and generation plants.

- The Illinois coal industry provides nearly \$1 billion to the Illinois economy each year.
- 80% of the coal mined in Illinois is shipped to other states.
- Approximately 2 million tons of Illinois coal is shipped to other countries annually.
- Since 1970, the use of coal to generate electricity in the U.S. has tripled to keep up with the U.S. growing demand for electricity.
- The U.S. Energy Information Administration projects that U.S. need for electricity will increase an additional 30% by 2030.
- The 1600 megawatt Prairie State coal-fired power plant meets or exceeds 2018 EPA standards, cleared twenty-seven environmentalist concerns and will start generating electricity the end of 2011.
- Prairie State sulfur dioxide emissions will be 98% less; nitrogen oxide will be 86% less; particulate matter will be 99.8% less and

carbon dioxide will be 15% less than coal-fired power plants operating in the 1970s.

 The Prairie State power plant will provide approximately twothirds of Eastern Illini Electric Cooperative's member base load.
