
If you don't have prescription coverage or you have exemptions, check out the Co-op Connections prescription savings plan



f you are a member of Rural Electric Convenience Cooperative and you do not have prescription insurance, if you have certain prescriptions which are exempted from your coverage, if you max out your Medicare prescription coverage before the end of the year or you are in the Medicare "donut," you can save 10 to 60 percent on your prescriptions using our Co-op Connections card.

Our Web site, www.recc.coop, provides links taking you to a lot of information. On the home page, click the picture of the Co-op Connections Card, and then click the link for the pharmacy benefit. From the national Pharmacy Discount page, you can obtain a list of participating pharmacies. You can learn how to check the

price of a prescription – select how many miles from your zip code you will travel and it tells you the price at every participating pharmacy. If you are on a maintenance drug you can have your prescription mailed to your house.

So far this year through the month of May, our members used

the program to fill 249 prescriptions and saved over \$4,400 or 35 percent off the cost of buying the prescriptions without insurance. If you do have insurance, take in the card and check the discount from the card. If the discount is higher on the Connections Card,

you can use it, but not both programs together.
