Rock Cooperative Care Helps Members Pay Their Energy Bills

Oncern for Community is a guiding principle of coops throughout the nation and one that Rock Energy directors and employees consider fundamental to the cooperative way of doing business.

First and foremost, we strengthen our communities by doing what we do best: providing safe and reliable electricity at an affordable cost. But beyond that, our concern for community reaches to every member. What's good for the member is good for the community, and that, in turn, is good for the co-op.

With that in mind, we launched Rock Cooperative Care in 2009. It supplements the federally funded energy assistance program and benefits members who otherwise might fall through the cracks—those whose incomes are too high to qualify for federal programs but too low to make ends meet.

I'm proud to report that 129 members have received a total of \$27,000 in assistance through the program. These are your friends, neighbors, and relatives who are facing difficult times because they've lost their job, are dealing with rising household expenses on a fixed income, or are struggling with the cost of health care.

Many people are having trouble paying their energy bills for the first time, and Rock Cooperative Care is available to help them. If you think you qualify, please consider applying for assistance. An article on page 16c of this magazine contains all the details.

You might be thinking to yourself: "Where does this money come from?" That's a good question because we all know money doesn't grow on trees. If it did, raking every fall wouldn't be such a chore. Instead, we'd collect whatever fell and take it to the bank.

Rock Energy's board of directors created this reserve fund to supplement other energy assistance programs. At the time, the account was funded entirely by the cooperative and did not increase individual members' bills.

Then in September 2009, we unveiled Project Lift Up, an opportunity for members to voluntarily add spare change to the amount they pay on their monthly energy bills. That small amount of money can make a big difference in people's lives. About 150 generous members have signed up for the program, donating more than \$2,000. This amount is a wonderful start; I know we have many more members who would like to participate in this very worthwhile program.

If you'd like to help, you have four options:

 Round your energy bill up to the nearest whole dollar amount. If your bill is \$83.23, you would pay \$84

and the extra 77 cents would go to Rock Cooperative Care. The most you could donate would be \$11.88 per year.

- Add \$1 each month to your budget billing plan. If you are on the budget plan, your bill already is a whole dollar amount so \$1 will be added to your statement and your annual donation would be \$12.
- Add a set monthly contribution each month. This is the option for you if you want to make a larger regular donation. For example, \$5 could be added to your monthly statement for an annual contribution of \$60.
- Make a one-time only donation. The amount you select will be added to your next bill.

Rock Cooperative Care Offers Energy Assistance

Some Rock Energy Cooperative members need a little help paying their energy bills. They might earn too much to qualify for state and federal energy assistance, or they might need some extra money to supplement the other programs.

Either way, Rock Cooperative Care is available to help. Since the program started in 2009, a total of \$27,000 has been distributed to help members pay their energy bills.

A one-time grant of up to \$500 is available to help residential members who are struggling to pay their energy bills but do not meet more stringent state and federal requirements.

Check the accompanying chart to see if your household qualifies for assistance. For example, a four-person household would be eligible if the total annual income is \$63,600 or less.

The Salvation Army office in Rockford is administering the Rock

Scholarships Offered to High School Seniors

Rock Energy Cooperative again is offering scholarships to graduating high school seniors who enroll at an accredited school. Students whose parents or guardians are active members of REC are eligible.

In 2010, Rock Energy awarded 10 scholarships, each worth \$400, to graduating seniors from high schools in Brodhead, Clinton, Edgerton, Evansville, Milton, Orfordville, Rockton, and South Beloit.

Our scholarship committee will judge applicants based on general merit, cooperation, leadership abilities, financial need, and class ranking. Since 1989, Rock Energy has awarded more than \$64,000 in financial aid to deserving students.
