The goal is to get information out to our members as soon as we know it, during major outages.

You may be wondering ..."If my electricity is off, how am I going to check Facebook??" It is estimated that over 20 percent of consumers are using smart phones. A smart phone is a mobile phone that offers more advanced computing ability and connectivity than a contemporary feature phone. Members are now searching for information

through their smart phones. You may have family in another town or state that is not affected by your specific outage, and they can check our Facebook page for you, to obtain updates. Or, you may be able to use your computer at work, if your employer allows personal searches.

Another benefit to our Facebook page is to educate you on electrical safety, energy efficiency, our commitment to community efforts, etc.
