

The 2011 4-H Electricity School is co-sponsored by the University of Illinois Extension and Western Illinois Electrical Coop.

Participants will be divided into groups depending on their wiring and electrical experience. WIEC electrician Mark Kissinger will help beginning students learn the basic techniques. The more advanced students will make projects that will challenge them as well. All students will take part in skill sessions. The cost (7526-52) of the class will be \$10 which is the cost for materials only.

Students should bring a flat head screwdriver, pliers with a wire cutter, a wire stripper and a pocket knife (with parental consent.)

Who: Children ages 8-18 who live in Hancock or Henderson County. Students do not have to be a member of 4-H to attend.

When: Friday, June 24 from 9 -10:30 a.m.

Where: Hancock County Extension Center in Carthage.



## The Energy Efficiency Wall

onsumer-member education on "What Makes a Home Energy Efficient?" is the theme of Prairie Power, Inc's (PPI's) "Energy Efficiency Wall" constructed and utilized by PPI and its member cooperatives, including Western Illinois Electrical Cooperative in Carthage, IL. The 16foot "Energy Efficiency Wall" illustrates various opportunities for air infiltration or leakage within the common home due to poor construction practices and materials. The display addresses energy efficient construction

practices and materials, and energy efficient equipment and technologies.

The proper use of caulking around penetration points in the home's external walls, such as window and door openings, gas, water, AC and heating system fuel lines and ventilation systems, and the selection and installation of energy efficient insulation materials, ventilation equipment and lighting systems are just a few of the energy efficient items illustrated in the "Wall."

Utilizing the displays at member cooperatives' annual (7815-56) membership meetings, NRECA and Touchstone Energy regional events, community college workshops, homebuilder shows, county fairs and other events ... over 358,000 consumers have been exposed to the educational opportunities of the "Energy Efficiency Wall" in 2009.

This will be on display before and after the Annual Meeting. Be sure to come early so you can take in all this free information that this display has to offer.

### Notices to be mailed out in June


