
MAP LOCATION CONTEST

Don't hide the big green box

They are big. They are usually green. They sit on a pad in your yard. They are not the prettiest yard ornament in the world and homeowners may be tempted to hide the pad mounts behind (3715-49) land-scaping, fencing or shrubs. Please don't.

Western Illinois Electrical Coop. recommends leaving at least 10 feet of clear space in front of pad-mount transformers. In case of an outage, a lineman may need to open that green box to restore service. It is also a good idea to leave at least 3 feet of space around the other three sides of the pad-mount for easy access in case of an outage.





Use the moisture sensor feature on your clothes dryer if it has one. This option shuts down the dryer when clothes are dry. In addition, clean the lint filter after each load. This (483-3) improves air circulation and increases the dryer's efficiency.


