n Sept. 29, 200 fifth graders from five elementary schools in WIEC's service territory descended on the north edge of Carthage for the 16th Annual Safety Fair. Students heard about different

safety topics, including electrical safety, (3923-9) bike safety, Internet safety, weather, farm safety and emergency preparedness.

Kyle Finley of Live Line Demo brought a miniature electrical system to the Fair to help explain how electricity is delivered to homes and farms. One of the points he stressed to the kids was that if they were in an accident involving power lines to stay in the car. Marie Hopp, 9-1-1 coordinator simulated what happens in real life when 9-1-1 is called. There was even an ambulance on hand to simulate what they might do if the situation calls for it.

Dawn Weinberg played Farm Safety Jeopardy with the kids as a fun way

to learn about farm safety.

Energy Efficient Rebates Available!

With the HomE program, you can earn up to \$1500 in rebates for making energy efficient improvements to your home. Call WIEC at 217-357-3125 OR 888-576-3125 for more details. Below is a listing of upgrades that qualify:

- \$1,500 Geothermal heat pumps closed loop (14.1 EER or 3.3 COP)
- \$1,500 Geothermal heat pumps open loop (16.2 EER or 3.6 COP)
- \$1,000 Air source heat pumps (16 SEER)
- \$350 Natural Gas or LP furnace (95% efficiency)
- \$350 Central air conditioner (16 SEER)
- \$250 Heat pump water heater (2.0 Energy Factor)
- 30% of cost of insulation and weatherization (max of \$500)

Maximum rebate per household is \$1,500. Installation of improvements and corresponding paperwork must be given to WIEC by December 15, 2010.

Eight 2011 IEC Memorial Scholarships Available

Paul M. Dion, manager of Western Illinois Electrical Coop. has announced that the Illinois electric cooperatives will again in 2011 award seven academic scholarships to high school seniors through a memorial scholarship fund designed to financially assist deserving students in the "electric cooperative family." In addition, a new eighth scholarship – to assist with costs in attending an electric lineworker school – will be offered for the first time.

The eight scholarships of \$1,250 each will be awarded in 2011 through the Thomas H. Moore Illinois Electric Cooperatives (IEC) Memorial Scholarship Program.

Four scholarships will be awarded to high school seniors who are the sons or daughters of an Illinois electric cooperative member receiving service from the cooperative. A fifth scholarship, the Earl W. Struck Memorial Scholarship, will be awarded to a student who is the son or daughter of an Illinois electric cooperative employee. The sixth and seventh scholarships are reserved for students enrolling full-time at a two-year Illinois community college who are the sons or daughters of Illinois electric cooperative members, employees or directors.
