#### **Blood Drives**

This is a brand new program for us. SIEC is planning a blood drive with the American Red Cross in each county we serve. For those of us who can, giving blood is very important and helps save lives. Even if you cannot give for health reasons, your life may be saved by another SIEC member who can give blood. #### **Classroom Empowerment Grants**

Each year we give away seven \$500 teacher grants. Many local teachers spend a lot of money out of their own pockets for classroom items, because our schools' budgets keep getting cut. This is another way SIEC gives back to its communities. When our youth have good, solid learning environments, this creates better schools, which attracts more residents to our communities, which helps our local economy.

#### **Commitment to Community**

Another new program we are planning for 2014 is a "round up" project. For those of you who "opt in", we will use the extra change to help local community betterment groups and organizations. Let's say your electric bill is \$279.50 this month, and you round your check up to \$280.00. This means that \$.50 will go into a community account here at SIEC, and when enough has

accumulated, an employee committee will decide which local community project to help sponsor. More details are coming soon.

#### **Member Survey**

Every few years, we send out a detailed survey to random members to assess satisfaction. Later in 2014, we will mail out a shorter survey to get your opinions on some very specific items. Because your opinion is so important to us, and we understand your time is valuable, we will be offering five \$50 bill credits, to be chosen randomly from your responses. uddopted from your responses.

#### **Barn Quilts - Local Tourism**
