

Director nomination and election process


In accordance with Article IV, Section 4, of your cooperative's bylaws, a nominating committee must be appointed between 30 and 120 days prior to the Annual Meeting of Members (June 27, 2013).

Directors shall be elected by and from the membership by ballot and shall serve for a term of three years, or until their successors shall have been elected and qualified. The terms of directors from Districts #4 and #5 will expire this year.

District No. 4, currently represented by Calvin Baumann, is St. Albans, Chili, Bear Creek, and Prairie Townships in Hancock County, Illinois, and the cooperative's service area in Adams County, Illinois, lying south of St. Albans and Chili Townships.

District No. 5, currently represented by David K. Biery, is Carthage, Pilot Grove, and (9612-18-1) Fountain Green Townships in Hancock County, Illinois, and the cooperative's service area in Hire Township in McDonough County, Illinois.

The nominating committee must post a list of nominations at the cooperative office at least 20 days before the annual meeting. Any 15 cooperative members may act together and nominate another member by petition. These nominations will be posted with those made by the nominating committee. Nominations made by petition at least 10 days before the annual meeting will be included on the offi-



cial ballot. Later nominations by petition shall be treated as nominations from the floor. The chairman shall call for additional nominations from the floor. No member may nominate more than one candidate.


MAP LOCATION CONTEST

Still haven't decided about geothermal?

What are you waiting for?

For our members who are still unsure if now is the best time to install a geothermal heating and cooling system, what are you waiting for?

WIEC has five great reasons to go geothermal now:

- 1. Rebates through the HomE Lite program are still available. Call our office for more details or go to our website HYPERLINK "http://www.wiec.net" www.wiec.net. This program pays rebates of \$1,500 for installation of geothermal.
- 2. WIEC offers a rebate of \$1,000.

This can be applied to trenching, new electric water heater or can be applied right to your electric bill.

- 3. WIEC offers loans (5 year term at a 5% rate) to members with approved credit. The payments are (3811-44) added to your current electric bill so you have just one payment. How simple is that?
- 4. Federal Tax credits are available for energy efficiency tax credits.
- 5. Kilowatts used for geothermal heating and cooling are just 7 ½ cents instead of 12 ¾ cents regular rate.

What's the difference?

Ground Source Heat Pumps — Geothermal

What is it?

The earth absorbs energy from the sun making it a fairly consistent 55 degrees F all year long. Geothermal systems use the earth's energy to heat and cool your home. Because it uses the earth's natural temperature, geothermal is among the most efficient and comfortable heating and cooling technologies available. Loops can be set underground horizontally, vertically, in a lake or pond or in a well. Geothermal systems provide both heating and air conditioning and even hot water.

Geothermal systems are environmentally clean, very quiet and produce no dangerous gases. There is no outside unit and they are four times more efficient than a gas furnace. Geothermal costs more to install but the upfront cost is an investment that pays off with long-term savings. Geothermal systems can save 30-70% on heating and cooling bills. Your home must be well-insulated and the system must be sized properly to get the most benefit for your investment.

Air-to-Air Heat Pump

What is it?

An air-to-air heat pump moves heat. It absorbs heat from outdoor air pumping it indoors during the winter. In the summer, it absorbs heat from indoors pumping it outside. When operating in optimal conditions (about 30-65 degrees), a heat pump is extremely efficient. When outdoor temperatures become too cold, the heat pump needs to run constantly to produce enough heat to maintain a comfortable indoor temperature. Therefore a backup furnace (either electric or gas) is needed to provide adequate heat.

Providing a constant temperature, an air-to-air heat pump is quite comfortable. The only sound you'll hear is the fan. An air-to-air heat pump is efficient and can save 30-50% on heating and cooling bills depending on the size of the home. The higher the SEER rating, the more efficient your heat pump will be. As with any heating and cooling system, air leaks must be sealed and your home must be properly insulated.
