




# Help our dispatchers provide you better service during power outages!

SIEC dispatchers monitor your outage calls 24-hours per day through our automated outage reporting system. There are three simple things you can do to help our dispatchers provide you with better service: uoisgue frius

Make sure your primary telephone number is up-to-date in our records. The primary number we have on file is listed on your monthly bill. This is the number our outage system will key to when you report an outage. If this number is incorrect or if you have recently changed your primary number, please call us to have your records updated. If you call to report an outage using a different number, the system will ask if you know the primary number on your account.



You may still enter this number to report your outage.

Have your 8-digit account number available before calling in your outage. The 8-digit account number is listed on your monthly bill. Some account numbers have leading zeroes, which are important. If

the system does not recognize your telephone number or if you have more than one account, you will be prompted to enter your 8-digit account number.

It's not always necessary to leave a message. Do not leave a message unless the system does not recognize your telephone or account information, or unless you know the specific cause of your outage. Not having to listen to messages helps our dispatchers more efficiently get crews out to restore your service.

By following the above recommendations, our dispatchers can serve you better and more efficiently. To report outages or to update your primary contact number, please call 1-800-762-1400.
