Here are the rules for those interested in applying for a scholarship:

- Spoon River Electric Cooperative Scholarships are awarded to high school seniors who are the sons or daughters of a Spoon River Electric Cooperative member.
- Applicants must be enrolled full-time for undergraduate studies at an accredited two-year, four-year, or vocational/technical school the following academic year.
- Three \$500 scholarships are awarded, two based on academic performance and community involvement, and the other is honorary.
- All applicants must be present with a parent or guardian at Spoon River Electric's Annual Meeting June 19, 2014 in order to be eligible for a scholarship.

Canton 2014 Art on Main Fine Arts Festival

Canton Main Street will host the second annual Art on Main Fine Arts Festival on June 7-8, in Jones Park in downtown Canton. The inaugural event in 2013 enjoyed exceptional success, drawing 21 highly talented artists from four states to exhibit, and an estimated 2,000 visitors to the park over the two-day event. Local musicians and food vendors also contributed to making the festival a colorful, vibrant experience.

Planning is underway for the 2014 festival, and co-chair Cheryl Bielema says they are expecting the number of exhibitors at the event to expand significantly. Categories for the festival include painting/drawing, jewelry, glass, photography, clay/ceramics, sculpture, woven textiles and wood.

Canton Main Street is also soliciting sponsorships and other



types of support from businesses, organizations and the community, including volunteers. For the first event over 40 businesses and individuals pledged funds or in-kind services. New volunteers are especially welcome to assist with the event.

"We had almost 75 volunteers this past June," Bielema says, "and that really set us apart from other fine art shows. The artists were so grateful for the help with loading, unloading, registration and all the other work that goes into exhibiting in an event like this. The volunteers had a great time, and it made the festival a truly wonderful event."

2014 Farmers Market in Canton Underway

Canton Main Street will again host a Farmers Market in Jones Park in downtown Canton, beginning on Saturday, June 7, and continuing each Saturday morning through September 27. The Market will be open from 7:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m., and offer locally-grown produce, fruits, spices, baked goods, flowers and plants, jelly, honey and other fresh-to-the table items. Plans for this year include more educational food demonstrations, music and children's activities. The market is a collaboration between Canton Main Street and Spoon River College's agriculture program.

This will be the third year the Market has set up in Jones Park, and it has grown dramatically.

Canton Main Street is actively seeking more vendors to set up this summer. An organizational meeting for interested growers is scheduled for Monday, April 14, at the Old Historic Train Depot in Canton at 6:30 p.m.

Spoon River Electric Cooperative is Awarding Three \$500 Scholarships to High School Seniors

igh school students who are seniors during the 2013-2014 school year, and are the son or daughter of a Spoon River Electric member are eligible to apply for a \$500 Scholastic Scholarship, a \$500 Honorary Scholarship, and the \$500 Scott Parrish Memorial Scholarship, which will be awarded at this year's Annual Meeting on June 19, 2014.

Please fill out the form at the bottom of the page and return it to the Cooperative to participate. Applications must be turned in by **June 4, 2014** to be considered. Please see official rules and descriptions of scholarships below.

OFFICIAL RULES

- Applying students and their parent/legal guardian must be present at the Annual Meeting June 19, 2014, to win.
- Students must be a son or daughter of a Spoon River Electric Cooperative Member.
- Students must be a high school senior during the 2013/2014 school year and begin college undergraduate studies in the 2014/2015 school year. -Students must plan on attending a two-year or four-year accredited college or university, including vocational/technical schools.
- Scholarship winners must be full-time students (at least 12 hours) during the 2014-2015 academic year.
- Scholarships are for one year and are non-renewable.
- Past Spoon River Electric Cooperative scholarship winners are not eligible to recieve another one.

SCHOLASTIC AND SCOTT PARRISH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIPS

- The Scholastic and Scott Parrish Memorial Scholarships will be awarded based on an application detailing GPA, college entrance test scores, work and volunteer experience, participation in school and community activities, and a biographical statement.
- Semi-finalists will be notified by mail with a time and place for a personal interview.
- Those not chosen as semi-finalists for the Scholastic and Parrish Scholarships will be automatically placed in the Honorary Scholarship drawing.

HONORARY SCHOLARSHIP

- The Honorary Scholarship will be awarded by a drawing as students are recognized at the Annual Meeting.
- All applicants are eligible for the Honorary Scholarship drawing except the Scholastic and Parrish Scholarship winners.
