Their stories can be heart-wrenching, especially during the holiday season. The family's major bread winner was laid off more than a year ago and now the unemployment checks have stopped coming. Despite continual efforts, a job that will support a family is nowhere in sight. In another scenario, a child's illness resulted not only in high medical bills but also caused the main caregiver to take an unpaid leave of absence. The family now is devastated, both emotionally and financially.

operative Care in 2009 to help supplement other energy assistance programs and benefit members who otherwise might fall through the cracks because their incomes are too high to qualify for federal programs but too low to make ends meet.

Rock Cooperative Care is partially funded by Project Lift Up, a voluntary member donation program

that allows members to round up their monthly energy bill to the nearest dollar, add a set monthly contribution, or make a one-time donation.



As you count your blessings this holiday season and are planning your holiday giving, please consider making a donation to Project Lift Up. Just as the name implies, Project Lift Up helps give people a financial lift. In the process of giving, your spirit also will be lifted.

More than 200 co-op members have donated \$6,700 to Project Lift Up in the past four years. If you'd like to join them, just choose one of the following options on the form on this page and return it to Rock Energy.

- Round your energy bill up to the nearest whole dollar amount. If your bill is \$83.23, you would pay \$84 and the extra 77 cents would go to Rock Cooperative Care. The most you could donate in a year is \$11.88.
- Add \$1 each month to your budget billing plan, which already is a whole dollar amount. The annual donation would be \$12.
- Add a set monthly contribution—as little as \$1— each month.
- Make a one-time donation. The amount you select will be added to your next bill.

If you already participate in Project Lift Up, you can help make the holidays even brighter for others by adding a one-time donation to your generous contribution. Whether you're new to the program or increasing your donation, we'll give you three free CFLs to help you save money on your energy bill.

I want to express my deepest gratitude to all the folks who are donating to this program. Your act of kind-



ness shows the true cooperative spirit of Rock Energy members, who are always willing to lend a hand to help a neighbor facing difficult times. Since the program started, about 300 co-op members have received more than \$73,000 in benefits through the Rock Cooperative Care program. ### **LED Holiday Lights**

Most of us have gone through the frustration of trying to find the one light in a string of incandescent holiday lights that is either burned out or loose in its socket? When one light went out, they all went out. You won't have that problem if you switch to LED holiday lights.

LED stands for light-emitting diodes, which last longer and use significantly less energy than traditional lights. Operating LEDs on a 6-foot Christmas tree for 12 hours per day for 40 days is estimated to save 90 percent or more energy when compared to incandescent lights.

In addition to saving energy and money, LEDs also

save you the time and frustration of trying to find that one burned-out light. The lights don't have glass or filaments, which makes them durable and resistant to breaking. And because LED bulbs are so strong, one individual outage generally doesn't darken the whole strand.

Although LEDs cost more than incandescent bulbs, they'll pay for themselves over the long run. Because of their durability, they have an operational life span of about 20,000 hours, enough to last for 40 holiday seasons.

# **Rock Cooperative Care Offers Energy Assistance**

Some Rock Energy Cooperative members need a little help paying their energy bills. They might earn too much to qualify for state and federal energy assistance, or they might need some extra money to supplement the other programs.

Either way, Rock Cooperative Care is available to help. Since 2010, more than \$78,000 has been distributed to help members pay their energy bills.

A one-time grant of up to \$500 is available to help residential members who are struggling to pay their energy bills but do not meet more stringent state and federal requirements.

Check the following chart to see if your household qualifies for assistance. For example, a four-person household would be eligible if the total annual income is \$69,150 or less.

The Salvation Army office administers the Rock Cooperative Care program. If you meet the eligibility requirements, call either of these offices during regular business hours to schedule an appointment: Janesville, (608) 757-8300, extension 26; Beloit, (608) 365-6572; or Rockford, (815) 972-1135. Be sure to point out that you would like to schedule an appointment to apply for the Rock Cooperative Care program.

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) also helps eligible low-income households pay for winter energy services. The program's heat and electric assistance is a one-time benefit payment per heating season. The amount depends on household size, income, and energy costs.

### Scholarships Offered to High School Seniors

Rock Energy Cooperative again is offering scholarships to graduating high school seniors who enroll at an accredited school. Students whose parents or guardians are active members of REC are eligible.

Our independent scholarship committee will judge applicants based on general merit, cooperation, leadership abilities, financial need, and class ranking.

Since 1989, Rock Energy has awarded more than \$72,000 in financial aid to deserving students. Past scholarship winners have received up to \$400 to help with college expenses.

An application form must be completed by the student as well as by the student's guidance counselor. Applications are available at area high schools, at our Janesville and South Beloit offices, and online at www. rock.coop. Just click on Member Benefits.

In addition, scholarships of \$1,500 will be awarded through the Thomas H. Moore Illinois Electric Cooperatives (IEC) Memorial Scholarship Program. Applications are available at area high schools, our co-op offices, and online. The deadline is Dec. 31.
