It's always encouraging to see how many of you are engaged in the cooperative and care about being a part of the Annual Meeting. We were fortunate to have several special guests take time to attend the meeting, including U.S. Congressman Bobby Schilling, Illinois State Senator Dave Koehler and Illinois State Representative Mike Unes.

We had some fun that night by playing a trivia game, giving away gifts and enjoying dinner and cake. The "After Hours" barbershop quartet impressed us with their musical talent. We also took care of some business, the most important of which was an election. John Spangler of Marietta was elected by the membership to represent District 7. I know John looks forward to serving his friends and neighbors on the cooperative board, and his fellow directors look forward to hearing his ideas.

I also updated the membership in attendance with some financial and operational information. Our recent facilities charge increase of \$6 per month was part of that discussion. 2011 saw our Cooperative paying more for power, largely due to increasing regulations. has led to everyone else in the office having to step up and do more, which they have all done a great job at.

Something we enjoy at our Annual Meetings is awarding scholarships. This year we awarded three \$500 scholarships and five \$100 scholarships to high school seniors who are children of our members. Several of those students have expressed their gratitude for the money that will help pay for their college this Fall.

at what hasn't changed here, and ahead at what's in store. We still exist to serve our rural membership with power that is safe, reliable and affordable. Increasing government regulations have made it costlier to do that. But our focus remains on you, our members.


