Youth Day 2024



For more than 60 years, the electric and telephone cooperatives of Illinois have given tomorrow's leaders the opportunity to learn from today's public officials. On March 20, more than 200 students from across rural Illinois represented 25 co-ops during Youth Day, including seven from Corn Belt Energy Corporation.

"Youth Day gives students across the state an up-close look at democracy in action as they meet their elected representatives in Springfield," said Baylee Flowers, legal and government relations coordinator at the Association of Illinois Electric Cooperatives. "State senators and representatives have the opportunity to inspire and encourage the leaders of tomorrow during this annual event."

In addition to meeting elected officials, the students also learned more about their electric or

telephone cooperative's role in their own communities and had the opportunity to tour the Illinois State Capitol and the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum.

State Senators Sally Turner (R-44) and David Koehler (D-46) met with the students representing Corn Belt Energy. These students included: Vittorio Causarano, Austin Miller, Jaxon Carder, Maxwell Nord, Sarah Hill, Corinna Thomas and Isabelle Phillips.

During lunch, Illinois Department of Natural Resources Director Natalie Phelps Finnie addressed the students. She discussed her background as a healthcare provider and how she got into politics. She encouraged them to follow their passions, live confidently and work hard.

"You're embarking upon adulthood," Phelps Finnie said to the students. "You can do anything you want to do. I just ask that you come to adulthood with the right posture and attitude. ... Don't come with a sense of entitlement that everything is owed to you. Work for it. Earn it."

Participants also met Paris Van Dyke, the 2023-24 Illinois Youth Leadership Council representative, who was sponsored by Wabash Communications during last year's Youth Day. She spoke about her experiences over the past year and challenged attendees to say, "Yes."

"What I want to say to you today is something that I decided to do during this day last year ... take every opportunity," Van Dyke said. "You will learn so much if you just choose to say, 'Yes.'"

At the end of the day, attendees were interviewed for the chance to participate in Youth Tour, an annual trip to Washington, D.C., sponsored by Illinois electric and telephone cooperatives. This year's trip will be held June 14-21. Maxwell Nord and Isabelle Phillips will represent Corn Belt Energy on the weeklong trip and meet their elected officials, see historic sites, learn firsthand how cooperatives work and gain valuable leadership skills.



Advanced Metering Infrastructure (AMI) is here!

In early Spring, Corn Belt Energy began its Advanced Metering Infrastructure (AMI) upgrade.

AMI is an integrated, fixed-network system that enables two-way communication between Corn Belt Energy and its members.

It will improve accuracy, reliability and better integrated outage reporting.

Starting mid May, you will begin to see contractors, at your location, changing out meters. Please leave a clear path and make sure that your electric meter is always accessible to our installers. Contractors vehicles will be clearly marked with "Meter Contracting Crew" for easy identification.

Improved Member Services

In customer service, AMI will be an invaluable resource for assisting our members with high bill complaints.

AMI will deliver the data needed to provide our members with daily and hourly consumption. It will also integrate with our SmartHub app, which will give the ability to view daily and hourly consumption without contacting our office.

There will also be an improved handling of accounts, meter accuracy and support (i.e. connects, re-connects, transfer of service, blink history and usage data).

Improved Efficiency

With AMI, we will have the ability to verify momentary interruptions or blinks in your service. Sometimes blinks originate on our side of the meter, sometimes they originate on the member's side. Either way, AMI will help identify those problems and resolve the issue in a timely manner.

However, if you experience an outage, please call. Do not ever assume we know you are without power.

Safety

Enhanced meters have a detection built-in to alert Corn Belt Energy when something is wrong including overheating, tampering and low voltage.

Improved Reliability

These new meters will report. identify and isolate causes of power outages so crews can respond more auickly.

They will also enhance the ability to identify potential problems, and to plan and construct for our future power needs.

We hope to have the AMI project completed by the end of the year, if not sooner. Throughout the next six months, all main meters on our system will be replaced, and you will likely see our crews in your neighborhood.
