## New Year's resolution: be energy efficient year-round

### Seal in comfort and savings

As energy consumers, we can all contribute to conserving resources and lowering our bills.

Here are some practical tips to enhance your home's energy efficiency throughout the year.

### Know your energy consumption

Are you curious about your energy consumption? Do you want to see how your usage changes when the kids are away for a weekend or after you've removed that old freezer from the basement?

SmartHub allows you to track your electricity usage, showing you how many kilowatt-hours you're consuming. This ability enables you to adjust your home to lower your electric bill if you choose to do so! The opportunities for saving energy are endless! SmartHub also allows you to pay your bill, sign up for Autopay and Paperless billing, report an outage, and much more! You can download the free SmartHub mobile app for your smart device from your app store.

### Adopt no-cost ways to save energy

Small changes can lead to significant savings:



- Turn off lights and unplug electronics such as chargers when not in use.
- Close or lower window coverings to regulate the temperature indoors.
- Change your air filters regularly as recommended.
- Use ceiling fans strategically: counterclockwise in summer and clockwise in winter to force warm air down.
- Grill outdoors in summer to keep the heat out of the kitchen.

### Insulate your home

Weatherproofing is key to maintaining comfort and

reducing energy use:

- Check for air leaks around windows and doors using the wet finger or tissue test.
- Apply caulk or weather stripping to prevent drafts.
- Remember to keep doors closed to maintain indoor temperature.

### Get smart with your thermostat

Optimize your heating and cooling by using your programmable thermostat's features — many homeowners never use them — and allow it to adjust the temperature when you're asleep or away.

- Consider upgrading to a smart thermostat for automatic adjustments. (We have a rebate for qualifying Wi-Fi thermostats!)
- In general, adjust the thermostat a few degrees up or down for energy savings.

While student groups are organized at the state level, they all come together for Youth Day, where they get to meet each other and hear featured speakers who provide insight to the important roles electric cooperatives play in their communities.

# 2025 Nominating Committee meeting scheduled

The Nominating Committee will meet at the Corn Belt Energy office, in Bloomington, at 10:00 AM on Tuesday, February 11, 2025.

Any cooperative member who is interested in being nominated to the Board of Directors should contact a committee member prior to the meeting. The committee can nominate no more than two individuals for each expired Directorship.

As an alternative, any active cooperative member may also be nominated for election by petition. Any fifty active members of the Cooperative, by their petition, may propose the name of any qualified member as an additional nominee.

The nominated person must have

active service in the Board district of the vacancy, and no other Directors can live in the same township.

Petitions to nominate Directors must be filed at Corn Belt Energy's office no later than Monday, April 21, 2025. The election to fill the Director seats will occur at the Annual Meeting, scheduled for Friday, June 20, 2025, at Normal Community High School in Normal.

The Board of Directors is comprised of 11 active members who represent the membership in the operation of the Cooperative. The detailed procedure for choosing a Director is stated in our cooperative bylaws, which can be found at [www.cornbeltenergy.com](http://www.cornbeltenergy.com).
