If post-storm repairs to customer-owned equipment are necessary, we will advise you to work with a licensed contractor. If any charges are applicable, you will be billed through your account.

ENERGY EFFICIENCY TIP OF THE MONTH

Turn your suds into savings. Lower your energy use in the laundry room by washing clothes with cold water whenever possible, as heating water accounts for most of the energy used in a laundry cycle. Wash full loads to make the most of energy savings, and use high-efficiency detergent designed for cold washes. For drying cycles, clean the lint filter before each load to improve airflow and use dryer balls to reduce drying time.

Vegetation management

In order to help maintain reliable electric service, WIEC has contracted with IFP Land Services LLC (IFP) to handle brush and tree management needs again this year. They will handle spraying, trimming, cutting and removal of trees and brush.

We plan to have crews performing routine brush spraying this spring and summer in Bear Creek, Harmony, St. Mary's, Hancock, Carthage, Prairie, Rock Creek, Pilot Grove, Fountain Green, Pontoosuc, Durham and LaHarpe townships in Hancock County, Blandinsville township in McDonough County, as well as in Terra Haute, Lomax, Carman, Stronghurst, Gladstone, Biggsville and Media townships in Henderson County.

Fallen or overreaching trees and limbs account for many power outages, momentary flickers and blinks. Brush spraying and tree trimming are necessary to provide the continuous service WIEC members deserve and expect.
