87th Annual Meeting of the Members: Your Go-To Key Takeaways!

Egyptian Electric Cooperative Association (EECA) held its annual meeting on July 10 at the EECA headquarters in Murphysboro. As a thank-you for attending, all registered members received a \$20 bill credit on their August bill.

The Annual Meeting is a chance for members to connect, hear important updates, and take part in the democratic process that powers



the cooperative. If you couldn't attend, here are the highlights:

Board of Directors Election

Alongside the Executive Vice President/General Manager and management team, the Board oversees EECA's financial health, sets policy, and stays informed on key operational and strategic matters affecting the cooperative.

In a contested election, cooperative members reelected the following directors to serve new 3-year terms on the EECA Board of Directors:

- Kevin Bame, Murphysboro

Rising Power Costs

Members were notified of adjustments to the PCA/DCA

beginning on their August bills. The adjustments are necessary to offset:

- The rising cost of power supply, and
- Significant material cost increases due to anticipated tariffs.

By the end of 2025, EECA estimates an overall 3-3.5% increase in members' bills, with additional adjustments expected in 2026.

Despite these challenges, EECA's rates have remained significantly lower than other electric utilities in our area.

Capital Credits

One of the many benefits of cooperative membership is the return of Capital Credits. This month, EECA will return \$1,347,967 to members who received electric service in 1995 and 1996.

ENERGY EFFICIENCY TIP OF THE MONTH

Take advantage of "shoulder months," which refer to the transitional periods between peak heating and cooling seasons. During the fall, these milder weeks typically occur between September and November. Shoulder months offer a great opportunity to reduce home energy consumption as the need for extensive heating or cooling is reduced. Look for simple ways to boost indoor comfort without running your heating and cooling system. Use ceiling fans and open windows on breezy days to ventilate your home. On cooler days, add a layer of clothing and avoid running the heat.


