Petitions for board of directors are available

What does it mean to serve on the board?

Serving on Norris Electric’s board means you’re making a difference locally, using your individual talents and perspective to guide big decisions about the co-op that in turn benefit the larger community. While day-to-day decisions are made by co-op staff, major decisions are made by the board, whose mission is to look out for the vitality of the co-op and the community it serves. On a granular level, Norris Electric board members typically provide input and guidance on:

- budgets;
- co-op goals and direction;
- co-op’s community/charitable contributions;
- capital investments and upgrades in equipment and technology;
- renewable investments and energy mix;
- co-op’s role and involvement in economic development; and
- analyze and approve the Purchase Power Agreement.

The term of four directors will expire with the February 2026 Annual Meeting. The board seats are up for election with one board member to be elected from each county: **Lawrence, Richland and Wabash.**

Three incumbents intend to seek reelection. They are Ron Viehman,

Lawrence County; Brandon Graves, Richland County; and Dan Strine, Wabash County. Any members who reside and take service in any of the three counties above may submit a petition to be placed on the ballot.

According to the Cooperative Bylaws, all candidates must submit a petition signed by at least 25 members to be placed on the ballot. Requests for petitions will be available Nov. 19, 2025, and may be obtained by contacting the cooperative office. **Petitions must be returned to the cooperative office by noon on Dec. 30, 2025.**

Petitioners with qualified petitions will be placed on the ballot. Ballots will be mailed 30-45 days prior to our annual meeting. The results will then be announced at our annual meeting, to be held Feb. 28, 2026.



Brian Hemrich Retirement



Ready Your Home **FOR WINTER**

Prepare your home for winter now to ensure safety, efficiency and comfort. Here's a checklist you can use.



INSPECT HEATING SYSTEM:

- Have your heating system professionally serviced.
- Replace air filters if needed.
- Ensure vents and radiators are unblocked for efficient heat distribution.

TEST AND MAINTAIN SMOKE AND CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS:

- Replace batteries in smoke and carbon monoxide detectors.
- Test detectors to ensure they function properly.

PREPARE PIPES AND WATER SUPPLY:

- Insulate exposed pipes to prevent freezing.
- Drain and shut off outdoor faucets and irrigation systems.
- Know the location of water shut-off valve in case of emergency.

PREPARE YOUR HOME'S EXTERIOR:

- Clear gutters and downspouts to prevent ice dams.
- Trim trees away from the house to avoid damage.
- Ensure downspouts extend away from the foundation.
- Service and store equipment such as lawnmowers and trimmers.
- Gather winter tools such as snow shovels and ice melt.

INCREASE HOME ENERGY EFFICIENCY:

- Seal gaps at windows and doors with weatherstripping or caulk.
- Set ceiling fans to rotate clockwise to circulate warm air.
- Lower your thermostat a few degrees to save on heating costs.

STOCK EMERGENCY SUPPLIES

At home, have enough nonperishable food and water for 72 hours in case of power outages or severe weather. Experts suggest storing one gallon of water per person per day.

Include these essentials in your emergency kit:

- First-aid kit
- Flashlights and batteries
- Warm clothing
- Blankets
- Phone chargers and backup charger sources

Gather important documents, medical supplies/medicines and medical records. Don't forget your pets. Make sure you have enough supplies for them as well.
