## Julie Higginbotham earns national board certification

The electric utility industry is evolving rapidly, creating new challenges for electric cooperatives. As a result, the role of member-owners who serve on cooperative boards has never been more important. Their decisions help shape the future of the co-op, making a strong understanding of the industry, governance and cooperative principles essential.

We are proud to announce that Julie Higginbotham of Martinsville is the latest recipient of the national director's certification.

Julie recently completed the foundational coursework to earn the Credentialed Cooperative Director (CCD) certificate. She joins fellow board members Jeff Murphy of Marshall, Dan Gard of West Union, and Jeff Zimmerman of Oakland, who have also earned this distinction. Kevin Julian of Metcalf and Granville Colvin have achieved both the Director Gold Certificate and the Board Leadership Certificate.

The National Rural Electric Cooperative Association (NRECA) plays a vital role in meeting this educational need. Representing more than 900 member-owned electric cooperatives that serve 42 million people across 47 states, NRECA provides a wide range of educational opportunities for both cooperative employees and board members.

NRECA director education is offered in three progressive levels, ranging from foundational to advanced

coursework. Topics include director duties and responsibilities, understanding the electric utility business, strategic planning and financial decision-making.

## EnerStar Electric brings rural voice to Springfield

Electric cooperative leaders from across the state gathered April 14 at the Illinois State Capitol for Lobby Day, hosted by the Association of Illinois Electric Cooperatives.

The annual event provides an opportunity for cooperative representatives to meet with legislators and discuss key energy issues affecting rural communities. From EnerStar Electric Cooperative, President/CEO Angela Griffin and Board Director Granville Colvin were present to advocate for EnerStar consumer-members.

"EnerStar Electric is committed to working with lawmakers to ensure Illinois families and businesses continue to have access to affordable, reliable power," said Griffin. "Thoughtful,

balanced energy policy is essential to meeting the state's future needs."

Participants thanked lawmakers for their engagement during last year's energy omnibus bill discussions, emphasizing that their leadership helped ensure electric co-op members had a voice in shaping policy. During meetings with legislators, cooperative representatives outlined several priority issues.

Illinois electric cooperatives oppose House Bill 3762. While safety is a top priority, cooperative leaders noted the proposal, as written, is overly prescriptive and could impose additional costs and operational constraints. They stressed that electric co-ops already maintain rigorous safety training programs, have a strong culture of workplace safety, and are continuously adopting industry best practices to protect lineworkers and staff.

Co-op leaders also expressed support for House Bill 5195. The legislation would create the Illinois Future of Energy Choice and Economic Impact Commission, bringing together industry stakeholders and state agencies to address emerging energy challenges. The commission would help develop balanced, forward-looking energy policies that reflect the needs of utilities, businesses and consumers while maintaining affordability and reliability.

In addition, reliability concerns were highlighted. A central focus of Lobby Day was cooperative leaders' warnings about the premature retirement of always-available baseload generation resources and the risk it poses to grid stability. According to the North American Electric Reliability Corporation, Illinois is projected to face a high risk of energy shortfalls by 2028-2029 if new generation resources do not keep pace with increasing demand and plant retirements. Shortages could lead to price increases for consumers.

Throughout the day, cooperative representatives reinforced their commitment to the member-owners they serve, urging policymakers to consider the real-world impacts of legislation on reliability and affordability.
