County and parts of Fayette, Madison, Marion, St. Clair and Washington counties.

Clinton County Electric operates on a not-for-profit basis for the mutual benefit of its member-owners, and we are democratically governed by the membership. In short, Clinton County Electric is a business owned and controlled by you, the member.

You have the opportunity to become engaged in the democratic process controlling your cooperative by attending your Annual Meeting on Aug. 20. Matters of interest concerning your cooperative will be discussed, and you can participate in the election process for the Board of Trustees.

From the beginning, Clinton County Electric has had one central mission — to enhance the quality of life for our members. Your cooperative is committed to safe, reliable and reasonably priced electricity.

Clinton County Electric is a company that cares about the people it serves. That service goes a long way beyond keeping the lights on. It is neighbors helping neighbors. That is what it is all about — that is the electric cooperative tradition that started three quarters of a century ago.

Clinton County Electric has continued to develop our two main initiatives: “Enhance Our Member Communications” and “Infrastructure Improvements.” We worked vigorously on these in 2025 and continue to work on further development of these initiatives in 2026. Please take the time to read your monthly newsletter in the Illinois County Living magazine that we provide for you. Remember, all initiatives we embark upon always have our members’ best interests in mind.

At the Dec. 22, 2025, regular meeting of the Clinton County Electric Cooperative (CCEC) Board of Trustees, the board approved the 2026 Operating and Capital Improvement Budget that incorporated the second and final phase of a new wholesale rate for the power we purchase from Southern Illinois Power Cooperative. The new wholesale rate is better aligned with today’s energy market and will give CCEC the ability to offer new types of rates and programs that will give the membership the ability to better manage energy costs. The board and CCEC management are committed to providing safe and reliable services to benefit our member-owners while maintaining reasonable rates and financial stability. Undoubtedly these topics and many more will be discussed at the upcoming Annual Meeting.
