Storm Preparedness – National Preparedness Month

Are You Prepared?

Fall storm season is right around the corner, and National Preparedness Month is a good time to make sure your family is ready for whatever the weather brings. As your local electric cooperative, EnerStar wants to help you stay safe and informed when severe weather strikes. A few reminders to help you prepare:

- ☁ Build a kit. Every household should have flashlights, extra batteries, a battery-powered or hand-crank radio, a few days' supply of water and nonperishable food, and a first-aid kit on hand. Skip the candles; they're a fire risk.
- ☁ Report outages fast. During a storm, EnerStar crews work

around the clock to restore power safely and quickly. Call 800-635-4145 or report through SmartHub App as soon as you notice an outage. The more members who report, the faster our crews can pinpoint problem areas.

- ☁ Stay clear of downed lines. Always assume a line is energized. Stay back, keep children and pets away, and never attempt to move a line yourself. Report downed lines to EnerStar immediately.
- ☁ Generator safety. Never run a generator indoors or in an enclosed space. Always use a transfer switch to prevent dangerous backfeed onto power

lines, which can be a serious hazard for our lineworkers restoring power.

- ☁ Make a family plan. Talk with your family about what to do if the power goes out for an extended period – where to go, how to stay in touch, and what to do with perishable food or medications that require refrigeration.

Preparedness starts before the storm hits. Taking a few minutes this September to review your plan and restock your kit can make all the difference when severe weather strikes. EnerStar is here for you, rain or shine.
