July Storms Cause Damage In Member Areas, Rock Energy Crews Respond

A line of severe thunderstorms moved through northern Illinois and southern Wisconsin Friday, July 3, causing thousands to lose power and significant tree damage (see pictures to the left). As of 9 p.m. Friday, Rock Energy Cooperative had reported that numerous members in the Rockton, Roscoe and South Beloit service areas were without power. The storm brought heavy rain with some hail and winds with gusts as high as 60 mph.

Quick Response

Due to the storms and subsequent outages, Rock Energy crews were quick to respond. Many members reported the outages through SmartHub, which is a method that I recommend, as it's immediate, effective, and easy to do. To report an outage using SmartHub, just click on the "Report Power Outage" link on the left side of the SmartHub home page.

I would like to thank all of our members for your patience during difficult times like this. And thank you to the members who left kind comments for us. Here is one of the comments that we received following the storm.

"I have to shout out — Rock Energy Co-op did an excellent job following the storm. With massive power outages in the area, the prediction was power down at least 24 hours. Lines down, poles toppled over, trees on power lines, I started seeing lights go on around town within hours after the storm. I think I was without power maybe 5 hours. Went and bought lanterns etc., and the lights came on before I could get the batteries in them. People complain a lot about the power company, but give kudos when it is due. Great Job!!!!"
